#### National Night Out Tuesday, August 6, 2024

WHEREAS, National Night Out, "America's Night Out Against Crime," was introduced by the National Association of Town Watch (NATW) in 1984 as a unique crime/drug prevention event; and

WHEREAS, NATW is a nationwide, non-profit crime prevention organization that works to promote police-community partnerships in an effort to develop and maintain crime and drug prevention programs throughout the country; and

WHEREAS, National Night Out is a high-impact type of crime prevention event that has been developed in an effort to heighten awareness and strengthen participation within local communities; and

WHEREAS, National Night Out has proven to be an effective, inexpensive, and enjoyable program that strengthens neighborhood spirit and police-community partnerships in our fight for a safer nation; and

WHEREAS, while the traditional 'lights on' and front porch vigils remain a part of National Night Out, activities have grown considerably over the years to include community block parties, cookouts, parades, visits from police, festivals, neighborhood walks, safety fairs, contests, rallies, and meetings; and

WHEREAS, last year's National Night Out campaign involved citizens, law enforcement agencies, civic groups, businesses, neighborhood organizations, and local officials from over 15,000 communities from all 50 states; and

WHEREAS, citizens of Marina are encouraged to learn about crime prevention, community group participation, and neighborhood watch;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Marina does hereby proclaim the 41st Annual "National Night Out" for the 6th day of August 2024.

- 2. Authorize the City Manager to execute the amendment on behalf of the City, subject to review and approval as to form by the City Attorney.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

On or about September 1, 2023, while the City and Joby were in the process of obtaining the FAA approval of a permanent hydrogen fueling facility to be operated at the Airport by Joby, the City and Joby entered into a Temporary License Agreement ("License Agreement") for a term of one year, which granted Joby the right to grant Joby the right to use at the Airport the facility consisting of outdoor, fenced area for the operation of hydrogen aircraft refueling, hydrogen aircraft maintenance, and aircraft part installation (the "Facility"). The License Agreement is attached as **EXHIBIT A**.

The Facility is built on existing concrete and asphalt at the Airport and required no construction of improvements or modifications. The Facility consists of a 145x75ft area (total 10,150 square feet), three 40x8ft containers, and one 20x8ft container. The Facility is surrounded by a 6-foot-tall temporary fence with locks to prevent access and with knock box for exclusive access by fire officials. To provide power, Joby uses temporary power lines already onsite.

Since the parties entered into the License Agreement, the FAA issued the non-rulemaking airspace actions ("NRA") determinations for the temporary and permanent hydrogen sites. However, due to the delay in the construction of the permanent site, the parties wish to amend the License Agreement to extend the term for an additional year. The First Amendment of the License Agreement is attached as **EXHIBIT B**. Currently, the License Agreement is set to expire on or about August 31, 2024. All other terms of the License Agreement remain unchanged.

#### TEMPORARY LICENSE AGREEMENT

THIS TEMPORARY LICENSE AGREEMENT (Agreement), dated as of September 1, 2023, is made by and between Joby Aero, Inc., a Delaware corporation (Joby), and City of Marina, a political subdivision of the State of California (City).

#### RECITALS

- A. The City operates and maintains the Marina Municipal Airport (Airport).
- B. Joby is a Delaware corporation that operates an electric aerial ridesharing business.
- C. The City and Joby are in the process of obtaining the FAA approval of a permanent hydrogen fueling facility at the Airport, to be operated by Joby.
- D. For a term of one year, pursuant to the Airport Rules and Regulations, and on the conditions outlined herein, the City wishes to grant Joby the right to use at the Airport the facility consisting of outdoor, fenced area for the operation of hydrogen aircraft refueling, hydrogen aircraft maintenance, and aircraft part installation (Facility).

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the premises, covenants, and agreements of the parties set forth herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of all of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties, intending to be legally bound, do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Grant of License.</u> The City hereby grants Joby a temporary right to use a specified area at the Airport (Temporary License) for operation of hydrogen aircraft refueling, hydrogen aircraft maintenance, and aircraft part installation (Facility).
  - 2. Description and Operation of the Temporary Hydrogen Refueling Facility.
- (a) The Facility is built on existing concrete and asphalt at the Airport and will require no construction improvements or modifications. The Facility will consist of the 145x75ft area (total 10,150 square feet), three 40x8ft containers, and one 20x8ft container. The Facility will be surrounded by a 6-foot-tall temporary fence with locks to prevent access and with knock box for exclusive access by fire officials. To provide power, Joby will use temporary power lines already onsite. The location and plan of the Facility are shown on Exhibit A attached hereto.
- (b) The Facility shall have the option to operate between 7am and 7pm, every day of the week. The Facility shall adhere to OSHA and NFPA 2, 14, 55, 58, 72 standards and setbacks. All tanks and systems venting hydrogen shall be connected to vent stacks 60" above building highest point, or higher.
- (c) The use of the Facility shall be subject to the Airport Rules and Regulations for the safe and efficient operation of the Airport. The operation of the Facility shall not impair safe and efficient use of the Airport.

- (d) The Facility's environmental hazards consist only of low probability ethylene glycol spills in the amounts of less than 10 gallons. Joby shall install secondary containments for all areas at risk of spill.
  - (e) Joby shall be solely responsible for all Facility maintenance costs and expenses.

#### 3. Term of Agreement.

- (a) The term of the Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and shall expire one year after the Effective Date, unless earlier terminated as provided herein (Term).
- (b) This Agreement is not intended to affect or impair the ownership of the Airport and the title thereto.
- (c) This Agreement and the exercise of license right for the Facility shall not be construed to affect or impair any assurance the Airport is required to provide to the FAA pursuant to Section 47107 of Title 49 of the United States Code.

#### 4. <u>Indemnity and Insurance</u>.

- (a) Joby shall defend, indemnify, and hold the City and its officers, employees, agents, and authorized volunteers (Indemnitees) harmless from any and all claims, liability, losses, demands, damages, or injury of any kind, in law or equity, to property or persons, including wrongful death by or on behalf of any person, arising out of, resulting from, or relating to the use and operation of the Facility by Joby or its employees, customers, guests, contractors, suppliers of materials, tenants, furnishers of services, and invitees. It is the intent of the parties to provide the broadest possible coverage for the City.
- (b) It is the express intent of the parties that the defense and indemnity obligations imposed in this Agreement are binding, valid, and enforceable even if it is claimed or proved that the City or its Indemnitees were actively or passively negligent, strictly liable in tort, or otherwise responsible for any such claims, damages, injury, loss, liability, and/or expense with one exception: Joby shall not be obligated to defend, indemnify or hold the City and its Indemnitees harmless under the terms of this provision for claims, damages, injury, loss, liability, and/or expense to the extent caused by the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the City or its Indemnitees.
- (c) Joby shall secure and maintain general liability insurance sufficient to cover any liability for its actions on the Temporary License and Use Permit in an amount determined in the reasonable discretion of the City.

#### 5. Terminating Events.

- (a) This Agreement will terminate upon the expiration of the Term.
- (b) If Joby subleases to or allows use of the Facility by any other individual, entity, or agency, other than or in addition to Joby, without the City's prior written approval, which the City

may withhold at its sole discretion, the City has the right to terminate the Agreement after providing Joby with a thirty-day notice of termination.

(c) In the event of a material default or breach of this Agreement, this Agreement shall not terminate automatically, but the non-defaulting party may provide the defaulting party with written notice specifically identifying the nature of such default or breach. Defaulting party shall have thirty days from receipt of the notice of default to cure the default or breach, provided that if the nature of the breach or default reasonably requires more than thirty days to cure such breach or default, the defaulting party shall not be deemed in default if the defaulting party commences to cure within such thirty day period and thereafter diligently and in good faith prosecutes the cure to completion pursuant to the mutually agreed-to plan. In the event the material default does not or cannot be cured within a reasonable time, the City has the right to terminate the Agreement after providing Joby with a thirty-day notice of termination.

#### 6. Miscellaneous.

- (a) This Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be governed by, and construed and enforced in accordance with, the laws of the State of California. Any legal action or proceeding with respect to this Agreement may be brought in the courts of the State of California in Monterey County, or of the United States for the Northern District of California.
- (b) If a court of competent jurisdiction determines that any provision of this Agreement is invalid under applicable law, such provision shall be ineffective only to the extent of such prohibition or invalidity, without invalidating the remainder of this Agreement.
- (c) This Agreement sets forth the entire Agreement and understanding of the parties with regard to the subject matter hereof, and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous representations, agreements and understandings, oral or otherwise, between the parties with respect to such subject matter. No representation, agreement, arrangement, or understanding, oral or written, exists among the parties relating to the subject matter hereof that is not fully expressed herein. Except as otherwise expressly provided herein, no amendment or modification of this Agreement shall be effective unless approved in writing by all parties to this Agreement. Any amendment to this Agreement shall also obtain written approval of the City Council, if required.
- (d) The parties shall take and perform (or refrain from taking or performing) such further acts, provide all information, and execute, acknowledge, and deliver such other documents and instruments, as may be necessary, advisable or proper from time to time to further evidence, confirm or carry out the provisions, intent and/or purposes hereof or to comply with any applicable laws, rules or regulations.
- (e) Any waivers of terms or conditions hereunder shall be valid only if set forth in an instrument in writing signed by the party to be bound thereby.
- (f) If any legal action or other proceeding is brought for the enforcement or interpretation of this Agreement, or because of an alleged dispute, breach, default, or misrepresentation in connection with any provisions of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall

be entitled to recover reasonable attorney fees and court costs, in addition to any other relief to which such party may be entitled.

(g) This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which when so executed and delivered shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

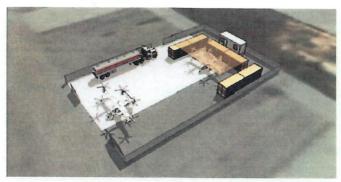

CITY COUNCIL TO CONSIDER ADOPTING RESOLUTION NO. 2024, APPROVING AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE CITY OF MARINA AND VARIOUS QUALIFIED FIRMS FOR ON-CALL PROFESSIONAL SERVICES IN THE DISCIPLINES OF PLANNING, AIRPORT ENGINEERING, ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN, LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE, CIVIL ENGINEERING, TRAFFIC ENGINEERING, ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT, AND GEOTECHNICAL ENGINEERING, AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE AGREEMENTS ON BEHALF OF THE CITY SUBJECT TO FINAL REVIEW AND APPROVAL BY THE CITY ATTORNEY.

#### **REQUEST:**

It is requested that the City Council:

- 1. Adopt Resolution No. 2024-, approving agreements between the City of Marina and various qualified firms for on-call professional services in the disciplines of planning, airport engineering, architectural design, landscape architecture, civil engineering, traffic engineering, environmental services, construction management and geotechnical engineering, and;
- 2. Authorizing the City Manager to execute the agreement on behalf of the City subject to final review and approval by the City Attorney.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The City regularly enters into various professional services contracts to support development approvals and delivery of capital improvements. Examples of professional services that have been used in the past and are anticipated in the future are environmental and traffic studies of the impacts of proposed developments that are paid for through fee agreements with developers. Professional design and testing services also support the delivery of projects within the capital improvement program. This process was effectively used over the past six years to provide the various professional services required for City business.

On May 7, 2024, the City Council approved the recommendation to solicit proposals for on-call professional services to streamline the contracting process and allow staff to focus limited staff hours on project delivery and development review.

On May 16, 2024, staff advertised a Request for Statement of Qualifications (RFQ) for on-call professional services. The City asked for Statements of Qualifications (SOQs) from consulting firms for nine service areas. Those professional service areas included planning, airport engineering, architectural design, landscape architecture, civil engineering, traffic engineering, environmental services, construction management, and geotechnical engineering. On June 14, 2024, the City received 28 proposals for the various professional service areas from several consultants in response to the RFQ. An initial screening of the proposals determined that 27 of the 28 were responsive submittals and eligible for evaluation. The one non-responsive proposal omitted required information.

City staff from the Engineering Division and Planning Division reviewed and rated the proposals. To have a sufficient pool of firms to cover the needs of City projects, staff selected up to four of the top qualified firms to recommend for agreements. Staff selected the consultants based on their local familiarity, example projects, expertise, and proposal. **EXHIBIT A** shows the firms that submitted proposals for various service areas and the 24 firms selected by service area.

#### **ANALYSIS:**

The use of on-call services has been effectively used to streamline the development approval process and delivery of capital improvement projects. Many of the professional service agreements the City enters into are under \$25,000 and involve seeking proposals from firms specializing within their respective fields of service. This results in a repetitive process to qualify firms for professional service agreements with the City. The use of on-call professional service contracts reduces the staff time needed to contract for services.

The total amount of consultant work to be requested and performed during each fiscal year term for each consultant cannot be well defined at the outset. However, the consultants will work on an on-call basis as defined by the City on a project-by-project basis. Accordingly, all work performed under the agreements will be pursuant to individual service orders that will have a specifically defined scope and schedule that will be negotiated on a project-by-project basis. Further, the individual agreements will acknowledge that the individual service orders will dictate the work done under each agreement, up to the not to exceed amount.

Staff recommends that the contract terms be set to expire on June 30, 2027, with the option to extend for one additional year. The contract limit would be \$300,000 per fiscal year, per consultant agreement, although the limit is not anticipated to be reached for all agreements. **EXHIBIT B** is a copy of the draft consultant services agreement for the selected consultants.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

This action only addresses the contracting process. The work to be performed under these on-call agreements has been budgeted for various projects in the Capital Improvement Program. There is no City obligation to expend any funds under these agreements. Staff will expend funds under these agreements to the extent authorized via City Council approved budget appropriations.

#### **CONCLUSION:**

This request is submitted for City Council consideration and possible action.

WHEREAS, on June 14, 2024, the City received 28 proposals for the various professional service areas from several consultants in response to the RFQ; and

WHEREAS, City staff from the Engineering Division and Planning Division reviewed the proposals and selected consultants based on their local familiarity, example projects, expertise, and proposal; and

WHEREAS, staff recommends approving the consulting services agreements for the selected consultants listed in Attachment 1; and

WHEREAS, each consultant contract will be set to expire on June 30, 2027 with the option to extend the period of the contract by one year, and the contract limit for each consultant agreement will be \$300,000 per fiscal year.

With prior written notice to Contractor, City may elect to delete certain tasks of the Scope of Work at its sole discretion.
- (b) All work performed under this Agreement shall be authorized in advance and in writing by a specific Service Order prior to the commencement of services. Each Service Order given by the City shall describe the nature of the specific task or service to be performed by the Contractor, the time limit or estimated number of hours within which such task or service must be completed and the compensation for such task or service. Details shall include a description of the task or service which Contractor shall perform, the geographic limits, if any, the type and scope of task or services to be performed, the format and schedule for deliverables, the schedule of performance, and the schedule of compensation. Contractor shall not perform any task or service unless authorized by a fully executed Service Order. Contractor shall advise the Project Administrator in writing immediately of any anticipated change in any task or service, fee or time schedule, and shall obtain the Project Administrator's prior written consent to the change prior to making any changes. In no event shall the Project Administrator's consent be construed to

relieve the Contractor from its duty to render all services or perform all tasks in accordance with applicable law and accepted industry standards.

- (c) Contractor shall begin work under the Service Order only after receipt of the Service Order bearing the approval signature of the City Engineer. Each authorized Service Order issued under this Agreement by City shall be incorporated by reference as an integral part of Exhibit A and into the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- (d) The City's Project Administrator may, without invalidating this Agreement, order changes in any tasks or service to be performed pursuant to a Service Order by altering, adding to or deducting from the task or services to be performed. All such changes shall be in writing and shall be performed in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement. If any such change causes an increase or decrease in the Contractor's cost of, or the time required for, the performance of any of the tasks or services, the Contractor shall so notify the Project Administrator. If appropriate an equitable adjustment to the Contractor's compensation may be made, provided that any adjustment must be pre-approved by the parties in writing; with the City's approval coming from the Project Administrator.
- (e) Contractor shall perform all such work with skill and diligence and pursuant to generally accepted standards of practice in effect at the time of performance. Contractor shall provide corrective services without charge to the City for work which fails to meet these standards and which is reported to Contractor in writing within sixty days of discovery. Should Contractor fail or refuse to perform promptly its obligations under this Agreement, the City may render or undertake the performance thereof and the Contractor shall be liable for any expenses thereby incurred.
- (f) If services under this Agreement are to be performed by a design professional, as that term is defined in California Civil Code §2782.8(c)(1-4), design professional certifies that all design professional services shall be provided by a person or persons duly licensed by the State of California to provide the type of services described in Section 1(a). By delivery of completed work, design professional certifies that the work conforms to the requirements of this Agreement and all applicable federal, state and local laws, and the professional standard of care in California.
- (g) Contractor is responsible for making an independent evaluation and judgment of all relevant conditions affecting performance of the work, including without limitation site conditions, existing facilities, seismic, geologic, soils, hydrologic, geographic, climatic conditions, applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations and all other contingencies or considerations.
- (h) City shall cooperate with Contractor and will furnish all information data, records and reports existing and available to City to enable Contractor to carry out work described in Exhibit "A" and the executed Service Orders. Contractor shall be entitled to reasonably rely on information, data, records and reports furnished by the City, however, the City makes no warranty as to the accuracy or completeness of any such information, data, records or reports available to it and provided to Contractor which were furnished to the City by a third party. Contractor shall have a duty to bring to the City's attention any deficiency or error it may discover in any information provided to the Contractor by the City or a third party.

#### 2. Term of Agreement & Commencement of Work.

- (a) Unless otherwise provided, the term of this Agreement shall begin on the date of its full execution and shall expire on June 30, 2024, unless extended by amendment or terminated earlier as provided herein. The date of full execution is defined as the date when all of the following events have occurred:
- (i) This Agreement has been approved by the City's Council or by the officer or employee authorized to give such approval, and;
- (ii) The office of the City Attorney has indicated in writing its approval of this Agreement as to form, and;
- (iii) This Agreement has been signed on behalf of Contractor by the person or persons authorized to bind the Contractor hereto, and;
- (iv) This Agreement has been signed on behalf of the City by the person designated to so sign by the City's Council or by the officer or employee authorized to enter into this Contract and is attested to by the Marina City Clerk.
- (b) This Agreement may be extended up to one (1) year upon written agreement of both parties. Contractor may be required to prepare a written schedule for the work to be performed under any Service Order, which schedule shall be approved by the City's Project Administrator and made a part of Exhibit A, and to perform the work in accordance with the approved schedule.

# 3. Compensation.

- (a) City liability for compensation to Contractor under this Agreement shall only be to the extent of the present appropriation to fund this Agreement. For services to be provided under this Agreement City shall compensate Contractor in accordance with the provisions of this Section and the hourly rates attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by this reference. The total annual compensation under this agreement shall be limited to Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000) per fiscal year, which runs from July 1 to June 30, and the remainder of the first fiscal year of the Agreement.
- (b) The City will pay the Contractor under Service Orders on a time and materials/reimbursable expenses (T&M) basis. The hourly rate and reimbursable schedule in Exhibit B applies to all Service Orders.
- (c) This Agreement is for Contractor to perform "on call" services or tasks and as such it is a standby Agreement to assign work to the Contractor from time-to-time as needed and as appropriate. There is no minimum compensation for this engagement or for any work assigned pursuant to this On-Call Agreement and no guarantee that any work will be assigned to Contractor during its term.
- (d) Invoice(s) in a format and on a schedule acceptable to the City shall be submitted to and be reviewed and verified by the Project Administrator (see Section 5(a)) not more frequently than once during every month and forwarded to the City's Finance Department for payment. City shall notify Contractor of exceptions or disputed items and their dollar value within fifteen days of receipt. Payment of the undisputed amount of the invoice will typically be made approximately thirty days after the invoice is submitted to the Finance Department.

- (e) Contractor will maintain clearly identifiable, complete and accurate records with respect to all costs incurred under this Agreement on an industry recognized accounting basis. Contractor shall make available to the representative of City all such books and records related to this Agreement, and the right to examine, copy and audit the same during regular business hours upon 24-hour's notice for a period of four years from the date of final payment under this Agreement.
- (f) Contractor shall not receive any compensation for Extra Work without the prior written authorization of City. As used herein, "Extra Work" means any work that is determined by the City to be necessary for the proper completion of a Service Order but which is not included within the Service Order and which the parties did not reasonably anticipate would be necessary at the execution of the Service Order.
- (f) Expenses not otherwise addressed in the Service Order or the Fee Schedule incurred by Contractor in performing services under this Agreement shall be reviewed and approved in advance by the Project Administrator (Section 5(a)) and reimbursed to Contractor.

# 4. <u>Termination or Suspension.</u>

- (a) This Agreement may be terminated in whole or in part in writing by either party in the event of a substantial failure by the other party to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement through no fault of the terminating party, provided that no termination may be effected unless the other party is given (1) not less than ten days written notice of intent to terminate, and (2) provided an opportunity for consultation with the terminating party prior to termination.
- (b) If termination for default is effected by the City, an equitable adjustment in the price provided for in this Agreement shall be made, but (1) no amount shall be allowed for anticipated profit on unperformed services or other work, and (2) any payment due the Contractor at the time of termination may be adjusted to cover any additional costs to the City because of the Contractor's default. If after the termination for failure of Contractor to fulfill its contractual obligations, it is determined that the Contractor had not failed to fulfill contractual obligations, the termination shall be deemed to have been for the convenience of the City.
- (c) The City may terminate or suspend this Agreement at any time for its convenience upon not less than thirty days prior written notice to Contractor. Not later than the effective date of such termination or suspension, Contractor shall discontinue all affected work and deliver all work product and other documents, whether completed or in progress, to the City.
- (d) If termination for default is effected by the Contractor or if termination for convenience is effected by the City, the equitable adjustment shall include a reasonable profit for services or other work performed. The equitable adjustment for termination shall provide for payment to the Contractor for services rendered and expenses incurred prior to the termination, in addition to termination settlement costs reasonably incurred by Contractor relating to written commitments that were executed prior to the termination.

# 5. <u>Project Administrator, Project Manager & Key Personnel.</u>

(a) City designates as its Project Administrator the Public Works Director/City Engineer, Brian McMinn, who shall have the authority to act for the City under this Agreement. The Project Administrator or his/her authorized representative shall represent the City in all matters pertaining to the work to be performed pursuant to this Agreement.

- (b) Contractor designates \_\_\_\_\_, as its Project Manager who shall coordinate all phases of the Project. The Project manager shall be available to City at all reasonable times during the Agreement term as designated in Service Orders.
- (c) Contractor warrants that it will continuously furnish the necessary personnel to complete each Service Order on a timely basis as contemplated by this Agreement. Contractor, at the sole discretion of City, shall remove from the task or service any of its personnel assigned to the performance of services upon written request of City. Contractor may be required to represent to City that certain key personnel will perform and coordinate the work under a Service Order. Should one or more of such personnel become unavailable, Contractor may substitute other personnel of at least equal competence upon written approval of the City Administrator. In the event that City Administrator and Project Manager cannot agree as to the substitution of key personnel, City shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement for cause.

# 6. Delegation of Work.

- (a) If Contractor utilizes any subcontractors, Contractors, persons, employees or firms having applicable expertise to assist Contractor in performing tasks or services under this Agreement, Contractor shall obtain City's prior written approval to such employment. Contractor's contract with any subcontractor shall contain a provision making the subcontract subject to all provisions of this Agreement. Contractor will be fully responsible and liable for the administration, completion, presentation, and quality of all work performed. City reserves its right to employ other contractors in connection with this Project.
- (b) If work hereunder is performed by a design professional, design professional shall be directly involved with performing the work or shall work through his, her or its employees. The design professional's responsibilities under this Agreement shall not be delegated. The design professional shall be responsible to the City for acts, errors or omissions of his, her or its subcontractors. Negligence of subcontractors or agents retained by the design professional is conclusively deemed to be the negligence of the design professional if not adequately corrected by the design professional. Use of the term subcontractor in any other provision of this Agreement shall not be construed to imply authorization for a design professional to use subcontractors for performance of any professional service under this Agreement.
- (c) The City is an intended beneficiary of any work performed by a subcontractor for purposes of establishing a duty of care between the subcontractor and the City.
- 7. <u>Skill of Employees</u>. Contractor shall ensure that any employees or agents providing services under this Agreement possess the requisite skill, training and experience to properly perform such services.
- 8. <u>Confidential and Proprietary Information</u>. In the course of performing services under this Agreement Contractor may obtain, receive, and review confidential or proprietary documents, information or materials that are and shall remain the exclusive property of the City. Should Contractor undertake the work on behalf of other agencies, entities, firms or persons relating to the matters described in any Service Order, it is expressly agreed by Contractor that any such confidential or proprietary information or materials shall not be provided or disclosed in any manner to any of Contractor's other clients, or to any other third party, without the City's prior express written consent.

9. Ownership of Data. Unless otherwise provided for herein, all documents, material, data, drawings, plans, specifications, computer data files, basis for design calculations, engineering notes, and reports originated and prepared by Contractor, or any subcontractor of any tier, under this Agreement shall be and remain the property of the City for its use in any manner it deems appropriate. Contractor agrees that all copyrights which arise from creation of the work pursuant to this Agreement shall be vested in the City and waives and relinquishes all claims to copyright or intellectual property rights in favor of the City. Contractor shall provide two (2) sets of reproducible of the above-cited items, except for the computer data files which shall consist of one (1) set. Contractor shall use all reasonable efforts to ensure that any electronic files provided to the City will be compatible with the City's computer hardware and software. Contractor makes no representation as to long-term compatibility, usability or readability of the format resulting from the use of software application packages, operating systems or computer hardware differing from those in use by the City at the commencement of this Agreement. Contractor shall be permitted to maintain copies of all such data for its files. City acknowledges that its use of the work product is limited to the purposes contemplated by the Scope of Work and the applicable Service Order, should City use these products or data in connection with additions to the work required under this Agreement or for new work without consultation with and without additional compensation to Contractor, Contractor makes no representation as to the suitability of the work product for use in or application to circumstances not contemplated by the Scope of Work and the applicable Service Order and shall have no liability or responsibility whatsoever in connection with such use which shall be at the City's sole risk. Any and all liability arising out of changes made by the City to Contractor's deliverables is waived against Contractor unless City has given Contractor prior written notice of the changes and has received Contractor's written consent to such changes.

# 10. <u>Conflict of Interest.</u>

- (a) Contractor covenants that neither it, nor any officer or principal of its firm has or shall acquire any interest, directly or indirectly, which would conflict in any manner with the interests of the City or which would in any way hinder Contractor's performance of services under this Agreement. Contractor further covenants that in the performance of this Agreement, no person having any such interest shall be employed by it as an officer, employee, agent or subcontractor without the express written consent of the City Manager. Contractor agrees to at all times avoid conflicts of interest or the appearance of any conflicts of interest with the interests of the City in the performance of this Agreement. Contractor shall represent the interest of the City in any discussion or negotiation.
- (b) City understands and acknowledges that Contractor may be, as of the date of commencement of services under this Agreement, independently involved in the performance of non-related services for other governmental agencies and private parties. Contractor is unaware of any stated position of the City relative to such projects. Any future position of the City on such projects may result in a conflict of interest for purposes of this section.
- (c) No official or employee of the City who is authorized in such capacity on behalf of the City to negotiate, make, accept, or approve, or take part in negotiating, making accepting or approving this Agreement, during the term of his or her tenure or service with City and for one year thereafter, shall have any interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement or the proceeds thereof or obtain any present or anticipated material benefit arising there from.

11. <u>Disclosure</u>. Contractor may be subject to the appropriate disclosure requirements of the California Fair Political Practices Act, as determined by the City Manager.

# 12. Non-Discrimination.

- (a) The Contractor's signature affixed herein and dated shall constitute a certification under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the Contractor has, unless exempt, complied with the nondiscrimination program requirements of Gov. Code §12990 and 2 CCR § 8103.
- (b) During the performance of this Agreement, Contractor and its sub-contractors shall not deny the Agreement's benefits to any person on the basis of race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, age, sexual orientation, or military and veteran status, nor shall they unlawfully discriminate, harass, or allow harassment against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, age, sexual orientation, or military and veteran status. Contractor and sub-contractors shall insure that the evaluation and treatment of their employees and applicants for employment are free from such discrimination and harassment.
- (c) Contractor and sub-contractors shall comply with the provisions of the Fair Employment and Housing Act (Gov. Code §12990 et seq.), the applicable regulations promulgated there under (2 CCR §11000 et seq.), the provisions of Gov. Code §§11135-11139.5, and the regulations or standards adopted by CITY to implement such article. The applicable regulations of the Fair Employment and Housing Commission implementing Gov. Code §12990 (a-f), set forth 2 CCR §§8100-8504, are incorporated into this Agreement by reference and made a part hereof as if set forth in full.
- (d) Contractor shall permit access by representatives of the Department of Fair Employment and Housing and the City upon reasonable notice at any time during the normal business hours, but in no case less than twenty-four (24) hours' notice, to such of its books, records, accounts, and all other sources of information and its facilities as said Department or City shall require to ascertain compliance with this clause.
- (e Contractor and its sub-contractors shall give written notice of their obligations under this clause to labor organizations with which they have a collective bargaining or other Agreement.
- (f) Contractor shall include the nondiscrimination and compliance provisions of this Section in all subcontracts.

# 13. <u>Indemnification & Hold Harmless.</u>

(a) Other than in the performance of professional services by a design professional, which shall be solely as addressed by subsection (b) below, and to the full extent permitted by law, Contractor shall indemnify, immediately defend (with independent counsel reasonably acceptable to the City) and hold harmless the City, its Council, boards, commissions, employees, officials

and agents (collectively "Indemnified Parties" or in the singular "Indemnified Party") from and against any claims, losses, damages, penalties, fines and judgments, associated investigation and administrative expenses, and defense costs including but not limited to reasonable attorney's fees, court costs, expert witness fees and costs of alternate dispute resolution (collectively "Liabilities"), where same arise out of the performance of this Agreement by Contractor, its officers, employees, agents and sub-contractors. The duty to defend is a separate and distinct obligation from the Contractor's duty to indemnify and Contractor shall be obligated to defend in all legal, equitable, administrative or special proceedings upon tender to the Contractor of any claim in any form or at any stage of an action or proceeding, whether or not liability is established and the obligation extends through final judgment including exhaustion of any appeals. The Contractor's obligation to indemnify applies unless it is finally determined that the liability was caused by the sole active negligence or sole willful misconduct of an indemnified party. If it is finally determined that liability is caused by the comparative active negligence or willful misconduct of an Indemnified Party, the Contractor's indemnification obligation shall be reduced in proportion to the established comparative liability of the indemnified party.

- (b) To the fullest extent permitted by law (including without limitation California Civil Code Sections 2782.8), when the services to be provided under this Agreement are design professional services to be performed by a design professional, as that term is defined by said section 2782.8(c)(2) ("Design Professional") Design Professional shall indemnify, protect and hold harmless any Indemnified Party for all Liabilities regardless of nature or type that arise out of, pertain to, or relate to the negligence, recklessness, or willful misconduct of Design Professional, or such acts or omissions of an officer, employee, agent or subcontractor of the Design Professional. Design Professional shall not have an immediate duty to defend an Indemnified Party, however, Design Professional's obligation to indemnify (including reimbursing the cost to defend) and hold the Indemnified Parties harmless applies unless it is finally determined that the liability was caused by the sole active negligence or sole willful misconduct of an Indemnified Party. If it is finally determined that liability was caused by the comparative active negligence or willful misconduct of an Indemnified Party the Design Professional's indemnification obligation shall be reduced in proportion to the established comparative liability. Within 30 days following Design Professional's receipt of a properly presented written invoice Design Profession shall reimburse the Indemnified Party for the cost of reasonable attorney's fees and defense costs incurred by the Indemnified Party to the same extent of Design Professional's indemnity obligation herein. In no event shall the cost to defend charged to the Design Professional exceed the Design Professional's proportionate percentage of fault.
- (c) The provisions of this Section are not limited by the provisions of sections relating to insurance including provisions of any worker's compensation act or similar act. Contractor expressly waives its statutory immunity under such statues or laws as to City, its employees and officials. Contractor agrees to obtain executed indemnity agreements with provisions identical to those set forth here in this section from each and every subcontractor, sub tier contractor or any other person or entity involved by, for, with or on behalf of Contractor in the performance or subject matter of this Agreement. In the event Contractor fails to obtain such indemnity obligations from others as required here, Contractor agrees to be fully responsible according to the terms of this section. Failure of City to monitor compliance with these requirements imposes no additional obligations on City and will in no way act as a waiver of any rights hereunder.
- (d) If any action or proceeding is brought against any Indemnified Party by reason of any of the matters against which the Contractor has agreed to provide an immediate defense to any Indemnified Party, as provided above, Contractor, upon notice from the City, shall defend the

Indemnified Party at Contractor's expense by independent counsel reasonably acceptable to the City. Unless otherwise provided above, an Indemnified Party need not have first paid for any of the matters to which it is entitled to indemnification in order to be so defended. If it is finally adjudicated that liability for which Contractor has provided an immediate defense was caused by the sole active negligence or sole willful misconduct of an Indemnified Party, Contractor may submit a claim to the City for reimbursement of reasonable attorney's fees and defense costs.

(e) This obligation to indemnify and defend, as set forth herein, is binding on the successors, assigns, or heirs of Contractor and shall survive the termination of this Agreement or this Section.

# 14. <u>Insurance.</u>

- (a) As a condition precedent to the effectiveness of this Agreement and without limiting Contractor's indemnification of the City, Contractor agrees to obtain and maintain in full force and effect at its own expense the insurance policies set forth in Exhibit "C" "Insurance" attached hereto and made a part hereof and as may be required for any Service Order. Contractor shall furnish the City with original certificates of insurance, manually autographed in ink by a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf, along with copies of all required endorsements. All certificates and endorsements must be received and approved by the City before any work commences. All insurance policies shall be subject to approval by the City Attorney and Risk Manager as to form and content. Specifically, such insurance shall: (1) protect City as an additional insured for commercial general and business auto liability; (2) provide City at least thirty days written notice of cancellation, material reduction in coverage or reduction in limits and ten days written notice for non-payment of premium; and (3) be primary with respect to City's insurance program. Contractor's insurance is not expected to respond to claims that may arise from the acts or omissions of the City.
- (b) City reserves the right at any time during the term of this Agreement to change the amounts and types of insurance required for any Service Order issued as provided herein by giving Contractor ten days advance written notice of such change.
- (c) All required insurance must be submitted and approved the City Attorney and Risk Manager prior to the inception of any operations by Contractor.
- (d) The required coverage and limits are subject to availability on the open market at reasonable cost as determined by the City. Non-availability or non affordability must be documented by a letter from Contractor's insurance broker or agency indicating a good faith effort to place the required insurance and showing as a minimum the names of the insurance carriers and the declinations or quotations received from each. Within the foregoing constraints, Contractor's failure to procure or maintain required insurance during the entire term of this Agreement shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement under which City may immediately suspend or terminate this Agreement or, at its discretion, procure or renew such insurance to protect City's interests and pay any and all premium in connection therewith and recover all monies so paid from Contractor.
- (e) By signing this Agreement, Contractor hereby certifies that it is aware of the provisions of Section 3700 *et seq.*, of the Labor Code which require every employer to be insured against liability for Workers' Compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provision of that Code, and that it will comply with such provisions at all such times as they may

apply during the performance of the work pursuant to this Contract. Unless otherwise agreed, a waiver of subrogation in favor of the City is required.

- 15. <u>Independent Contractor.</u> The parties agree that Contractor, its officers, employees and agents, if any, shall be independent contractors with regard to the providing of services under this Agreement, and that Contractor's employees or agents shall not be considered to be employees or agents of the City for any purpose and will not be entitled to any of the benefits City provides for its employees. City shall make no deductions for payroll taxes or Social Security from amounts due Contractor for work or services provided under this Agreement.
- 16. <u>Claims for Labor and Materials.</u> Contractor shall promptly pay when due all amounts payable for labor and materials furnished in the performance of this Agreement, so as to prevent any lien or other claim under any provision of law from arising against any City property (including reports, documents, and other tangible matter produced by the Contractor hereunder), against the Contractor's rights to payments hereunder, or against the City, and shall pay all amounts due under the Unemployment Insurance Act with respect to such labor.
- 17. <u>Discounts.</u> Contractor agrees to offer the City any discount terms that are offered to its best customers for the goods and services to be provided herein, and apply such discounts to payment made under this Agreement which meet the discount terms.
- **18.** Cooperation; Further Acts. The Parties shall fully cooperate with one another, and shall take any additional acts or sign any additional documents as may be necessary, appropriate or convenient to attain the purposes of this Agreement.
- Dispute Resolution. If any dispute arises between the parties as to proper interpretation or application of this Agreement, the parties shall first meet and confer in a good faith attempt to resolve the matter between themselves. If the dispute is not resolved by meeting and conferring, the matter shall be submitted for formal mediation to a mediator selected mutually by the parties. The expenses of such mediation shall be shared equally between the parties. If the dispute is not or cannot be resolved by mediation, the parties may mutually agree (but only as to those issues of the matter not resolved by mediation) to submit their dispute to arbitration. Before commencement of the arbitration, the parties may elect to have the arbitration proceed on an informal basis; however, if the parties are unable so to agree, then the arbitration shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of the American Arbitration Association. The decision of the arbitrator shall be binding, unless within thirty days after issuance of the arbitrator's written decision, any party files an action in court. Venue and jurisdiction for any such action between the parties shall lie in the Superior Court for the County of Monterey.

# 20. Compliance with Laws.

- (a) Each party's performance hereunder shall comply with all applicable laws of the United States of America, the State of California and the City including but not limited to laws regarding health and safety, labor and employment, wage and hours and licensing laws which affect employees. This Agreement shall be governed by, enforced and interpreted under the laws of the State of California. Contractor shall comply with new, amended or revised laws, regulations or procedures that apply to the performance of this Agreement., those dealing with prevailing wages, apprentices, certified payrolls and hours of work.
- (b) Contractor shall conduct all work in strict accordance with applicable regulations and guidelines adopted by the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) and the California

Department of Industrial Relations (DIR), Division of Occupational Safety and Health, Safety for the prevention of COVID-19 and the regulations and guidelines for the prevention of COVID-19 adopted by the County of Monterey and by the City.

- (c) Contractor represents that it has obtained and presently holds all permits and licenses necessary for performance hereunder, including a Business License required by the City's Business License Ordinance. For the term covered by this Agreement, the Contractor shall maintain or obtain as necessary, such permits and licenses and shall not allow them to lapse, be revoked or suspended.
- (d) This Agreement is not intended and shall not be utilized for a public work as that term is used in California Labor Code Section 1720 *et seq*.
- 21. <u>Assignment or Transfer.</u> This Agreement or any interest herein may not be assigned, hypothecated or transferred, either directly or by operation of law, without the prior written consent of the City. Any attempt to do so shall be null and void, and any assignees, hypothecates or transferees shall acquire no right or interest by reason of such attempted assignment, hypothecation or transfer.
- **22.** <u>Notices.</u> All notices required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be personally delivered, sent by facsimile ("fax") or certified mail, postage prepaid with return receipt requested, addressed as follows:

Notice shall be deemed effective on the date personally delivered or transmitted by facsimile or, if mailed, three days after deposit in the custody of the U.S. Postal Service. A copy of any notice sent as provided herein shall also be delivered to the Project Administrator and Project Manager.

- **23.** Amendments, Changes or Modifications. This Agreement and any Service Order are not subject to amendment, change or modification except by a writing signed by the authorized representatives of City and Contractor.
- **24.** Force Majeure. Notwithstanding any other provisions hereof, neither Contractor nor City shall be held responsible or liable for failure to meet their respective obligations under this Agreement and any Service Order if such failure shall be due to causes beyond Contractor's or the City's control. Such causes include but are not limited to: strike, fire, flood, civil disorder, act of God or of the public enemy, act of the federal government, or any unit of state of local government in either sovereign or contractual capacity, epidemic, quarantine restriction, or delay in transportation to the extent that they are not caused by the party's willful or negligent acts or omissions, and to the extent that they are beyond the party's reasonable control.

- **25.** Attorney's Fees. In the event of any controversy, claim or dispute relating to this Agreement, any Service Order, or the breach thereof, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the losing party reasonable expenses, attorney's fees and costs.
- **26.** Successors and Assigns. All of the terms, conditions and provisions of this Agreement shall apply to and bind the respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns of the parties. Nothing in this paragraph is intended to affect the limitation on assignment.
- **27.** Authority to Enter Agreement. Contractor has all requisite power and authority to conduct its business and to execute, deliver and perform the Agreement and any Service Order. Each party warrants that the individuals who have signed this Agreement and shall sign Service Orders have the legal power, right and authority to make this Agreement and bind each respective party.
- **Waiver.** A waiver of a default of any term of this Agreement or the terms and conditions of any Service Order shall not be construed as a waiver of any succeeding default or as a waiver of the provision itself. A party's performance after the other party's default shall not be construed as a waiver of that default.
- **29.** <u>Severability.</u> Should any portion of this Agreement or any Service Order be determined to be void or unenforceable, such shall be severed from the whole and the Agreement will continue as modified.
- **Construction, References, Captions.** Since the parties or their agents have participated fully in the preparation of this Agreement, the language of this Agreement shall be construed simply, according to its fair meaning, and not strictly for or against any party. Any term referencing time, days or period for performance shall be deemed calendar days and not workdays. The captions of the various sections are for convenience and ease of reference only, and do not define, limit, augment or describe the scope, content or intent of this Agreement.
- 31. Advice of Counsel. The parties agree that they are aware that they have the right to be advised by counsel with respect to the negotiations, terms and conditions of this Agreement, and that the decision of whether or not to seek the advice of counsel with respect to this Agreement is a decision which is the sole responsibility of each of the parties hereto. This Agreement shall not be construed in favor or against either party by reason of the extent to which each party participated in the drafting of this Agreement.
- **22.** Counterparts. This Agreement and any Service Order may be signed in counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original.
- **33.** Time. Time is of the essence in this contract.
- 34. Entire Agreement. This Agreement together with the Service Orders to be issued hereunder contains the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the matters as set forth in this Agreement, and no other agreement, statement or promise made by or to any party or by or to any employee, officer or agent of any party, which is not contained in this Agreement shall be binding or valid. The exhibits attached hereto and the Service Orders to be attached as part of Exhibit A are incorporated into this Agreement. In the event of a conflict between the terms of this Agreement and any exhibit of Service Order, the terms of this Agreement shall control.

# **Exhibit C - Insurance**

Contractor agrees to provide insurance in accordance with the requirements set forth herein. If Contractor uses existing coverage to comply with these requirements and that coverage does not meet the requirements set forth herein, Contractor agrees to amend, supplement or endorse the existing coverage to do so. Contractor shall furnish the City with original certificates of insurance, manually autographed in ink by a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf. All certificates and endorsements must be received and approved by the City before any work commences. The City reserves its right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies at any time. The following coverage will be provided by Contractor and maintained on behalf of the City and in accordance with the requirements set forth herein.

Commercial General Liability (primary). Commercial general liability insurance covering Contractor's operations (and products where applicable) is required whenever the City is at risk of third party claims which may arise out of Contractor's work or presence on City premises. Contractual liability coverage is a required inclusion in this insurance.

Primary insurance shall be provided on ISO-CGL form No. CG 00 01 11 85 or 88 or on an ISO or ACORD form providing coverage at least as broad as ISO form CG 00 01 10 01 and approved in advance by the City Attorney and Risk Manager. Total limits shall be no less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) combined single limit per occurrence for all coverages. If commercial general liability insurance or other form with a general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this Project or the general aggregate limit shall be two million dollars (\$2,000,000). Contractor must give written notice to the City of any pending claim, action or lawsuit which has or may diminish the aggregate. If any such claim or lawsuit exists, Contractor shall be required, prior to commencing work under this Agreement, to restore the impaired aggregate or prove it has replacement insurance protection to the satisfaction of the City Attorney and Risk Manager.

City, its Council, boards and commissions, officers, employees, agents and volunteers shall be added as additional insureds using ISO additional insured endorsement form CG 20 10 11 85 or forms CG 20 10 10 01 and CG 20 37 10 01. Coverage shall apply on a primary, non-contributing basis in relation to any other insurance or self-insurance, primary or excess, available to the City or any agent of City. Coverage is not expected to respond to the claims which may arise from the acts or omissions of the City. Coverage shall not be limited to the vicarious liability or supervisory role of any additional insured. Coverage shall contain no contractors' limitation endorsement. There shall be no endorsement or modification limiting the scope of coverage for liability arising from pollution, explosion, collapse, underground property damage or employment-related practices.

Umbrella Liability Insurance. Umbrella liability insurance (over primary) shall apply to bodily injury/property damage, personal injury/advertising injury, contractual liability and completed operations at a minimum, and shall be in an amount of not less than two mission dollars (\$2,000,000), and include a "drop down" provision providing primary coverage above a maximum \$25,000.00 self-insured retention for liability not covered by primary policies but covered by the umbrella policy. Coverage shall be following form to any underlying coverage.

Coverage shall be provided on a "pay on behalf" basis, with defense costs payable in addition to policy limits. There shall be no cross liability exclusion and no contractor's limitation endorsement. Policies limits shall be not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and in the aggregate, above any limits required in the underlying policies shall have starting and ending dates concurrent with the underlying coverage.

**Business Auto.** Automobile liability insurance is required where vehicles are used in performing the work under this Agreement or where vehicles are driven off-road on City premises, it is not required for simple commuting unless City is paying mileage. However, compliance with California law requiring auto liability insurance is a contractual requirement.

If automobile insurance is required for work under this Agreement, primary coverage shall be written on ISO Business Auto Coverage form CA 00 01 06 92 including symbol 1 (Any Auto) or on an ISO or ACORD form providing coverage at least as broad as CA 00 01 10 01 approved by the City Attorney and Risk Manager. Coverage shall be endorsed to stated that the City, its Council, boards and commissions, officers, employees, agents and volunteers shall be added as additional insureds with respect to the ownership, operation, maintenance, use, loading or unloading of any auto owned, leased, hired or borrowed by the Contractor or for which the Contractor is responsible. Limits shall be no less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage. Starting and ending dates shall be concurrent. If Contractor owns no autos, a non-owned auto endorsement to the commercial general liability policy described above is acceptable.

Workers' Compensation/Employers' Liability. Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability insurance are not required for single-person contractors. However, under California law these coverages (or a copy of the State's Consent to Self-Insure) must be provided if Contractor has any employees at any time during the period of this Agreement. Policy(s) shall be written on a policy form providing workers' compensation statutory benefits as required by law. Employers' liability limits shall be no less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident or disease and shall be scheduled under any umbrella policy described above. Unless otherwise agreed, policy(s) shall be endorsed to waive any right of subrogation as respects the City, its Council, boards and commissions, officers, employees, agents and volunteers.

**Property Insurance.** Property insurance, in a form and amount approved by the City Attorney and Risk Manager, is required for Contractors having exclusive use of premises or equipment owned or controlled by the City. City is to be named a Loss Payee As Its Interest May Appear in property insurance in which the City has an interest, e.g., as a lien holder. Fire damage legal liability is required for persons occupying a portion of City premises.

Errors and Omissions/Professional Liability. Errors and Omissions or professional liability coverage appropriate to Contractor's profession, in a form and amount approved by the City Attorney and Risk Manager, will be specified on a Service Order-specific basis if Contractor is working as a licensed professional. Contractor shall maintain such insurance for a period of five years following completion of work or services. Such insurance shall be in an amount of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per claim and in annual aggregate. Contractor shall maintain such insurance in place for a period of five years following completion of work or services provided under this Agreement. Such continuation coverage may be provided by one of the following: (1) renewal of the existing policy; (2) an extended reporting period endorsement; or (3) replacement insurance with a retroactive date no later than commencement of the work or services under this Agreement.

# **Contractor and City further agree as follows:**

- a) This Exhibit supersedes all other sections and provisions of this Agreement to the extent that any other section or provision conflicts with or impairs the provisions of this Exhibit.
- b) Nothing contained in this Exhibit is to be construed as affecting or altering the legal status of the parties to this Agreement. The insurance requirements set forth in this Exhibit are intended to be separate and distinct from any other provision in this Agreement and shall be interpreted as such.
- c) All insurance coverage and limits provided pursuant to this Agreement shall apply to the full extent of the policies involved, available or applicable. Nothing contained in this Agreement or any other agreement relating to the City or its operations limits the application of such insurance coverage.
- d) Requirements of specific coverage features or limits contained in this Exhibit are not intended as a limitation on coverage, limits or other requirements, or a waiver of any coverage normally provided by any insurance. Specific reference to a given coverage feature is for purposes of clarification only and is not intended by any party to be all inclusive, or to the exclusion of other coverage, or a waiver of any type.
- e) For purposes of insurance coverage only, this Agreement will be deemed to have been executed immediately upon any party hereto taking any steps that can be deemed to be in furtherance of or toward performance of this Agreement.
- f) All general or auto liability insurance coverage provided pursuant to this Agreement, or any other agreements pertaining to the performance of this Agreement, shall not prohibit Contractor, Contractor's employees, or agents from waiving the right of subrogation prior to a loss. Contractor hereby waives all rights of subrogation against the City.
- g) Unless otherwise approved by City, Contractor's insurance shall be written by insurers authorized and admitted to do business in the State of California with a minimum "Best's" Insurance Guide Rating of "A:VII." Self-insurance will not be considered to comply with these insurance specifications.
- h) In the event any policy of insurance required under this Agreement does not comply with these requirements or is canceled and not replaced, City has the right but not the duty to obtain the insurance it deems necessary and any premium paid by City will be promptly reimbursed by Contractor.
- i) Contractor agrees to provide evidence of the insurance required herein, satisfactory to City Attorney and Risk Manager, consisting of certificate(s) of insurance evidencing all of the coverages required and an additional endorsement to Contractor's general liability and umbrella liability policies using ISO form CG 20 10 11 85. Certificate(s) are to reflect that the insurer will provide at least thirty days written notice of cancellation, material reduction in coverage or reduction in limits and ten days written notice for non-payment of premium. Contractor agrees to require its insurer to modify such certificates to delete any exculpatory wording stating that failure of the insurer to mail written notice of cancellation imposes no obligation, and to delete

the word "endeavor" with regard to any notice provisions. Contractor agrees to provide complete copies of policies to City within ten days of City's request for said copies.

- j) Contractor shall provide proof that policies of insurance required herein expiring during the term of this Agreement have been renewed or replaced with other policies providing at least the same coverage. Such proof will be furnished at least two weeks prior to the expiration of the coverages.
- k) Any actual or alleged failure on the part of the City or any other additional insured under these requirements to obtain proof of insurance required under this Agreement in no way waives any right or remedy of City or any additional insured, in this or any other regard.
- l) Contractor agrees to require all subcontractors or other parties hired for this Project to provide workers' compensation insurance as required herein and general liability insurance naming as additional insureds all parties to this Agreement. Contractor agrees to obtain certificates evidencing such coverage and make reasonable efforts to ensure that such coverage is provided as required here. Contractor agrees to require that no contract used by any subcontractor, or contracts Contractor enters into on behalf of City, will reserve the right to charge back to City the cost of insurance required by this Agreement. Contractor agrees that upon request, all agreements with subcontractors or others with whom Contractor contracts with on behalf of City, will be submitted to City for review. Contractor acknowledges that such contracts or agreements may require modification if the insurance requirements do not reflect the requirements herein. Failure of City to request copies of such agreements will not impose any liability on City, its Council, boards and commissions, officers, employees, agents and volunteers.
- m) If Contractor is a Limited Liability Company, general liability coverage must be amended so that the Limited Liability Company and its Managers, Affiliates, employees, agents and other persons necessary or incidental to its operation are insureds.
- n) Contractor agrees to provide immediate notice to City of any claim or loss against Contractor that includes City as a defendant. City assumes no obligation or liability by such notice, but has the right (but not the duty) to monitor the handling of any such claim or claims if they are likely to involve the City.
- o) Coverage will not be limited to the specific location or individual entity designated as the address of the Project. Contractor agrees to have its coverage endorsed so that all coverage limits required pursuant to this requirement are available separately for each and every location at which Contractor conducts operations of any type on behalf of City. Contractor warrants that these limits will not be reduced or exhausted except for losses attributable to those specific locations and not by losses attributable to any other operations of Contractor.
- p) Contractor agrees not to attempt to avoid its defense and indemnity obligations to City, its Council, boards and commissions, officers, employees, agents and volunteers by using as a defense Contractor's statutory immunity under workers' compensation or similar statutes.
- r) Contractor agrees to ensure that coverage provided to meet these requirements is applicable separately to each insured and that there will be no cross liability exclusions that preclude coverage for suits between Contractor and City or between City and any other insured or Named Insured under the policy, or between City and any party associated with City or its employees.

- s) Contractor shall maintain commercial general liability, and if necessary, commercial umbrella liability insurance, with a limit of not less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000) each occurrence for at least three years following substantial completion of the work.
- u) City reserves the right to modify the insurance requirements set forth herein in accordance with the terms of any specific Service Order issued as provided by the Agreement.

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the City Council:

1. Consider adopting Resolution No. 2024-, authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement on behalf of the City subject to final review and approval by the City Attorney.

# **BACKGROUND:**

On December 8, 2021, an on-site Marina community engagement workshop was held to ask local youth what they want to see in new playground equipment. Marina Youth and Teen Center members, as well as members of the Youth Commission participated. Participant feedback trended toward taller and faster slides, multiple swing options, climbers, use of natural materials, and more inclusive play options.

On February 27, 2023, another on-site Marina community engagement workshop was held to receive input on future playground options. There were 36 participants between the ages of 5-12. Feedback from this workshop was congruent with the previous workshop. Feedback trended toward taller structures, faster slides, swing options, and climbing options. This group also requested spinners and music options.

The existing Windy Hill playground equipment is outdated and not in alignment with the feedback received. The playground was installed approximately 11 years ago, and it was installed over a sand base. Sand is not the most suitable playground material for impact absorption and restricts the height of the equipment allowable. This impacted the type of equipment that was installed 11 years ago. Sand is also a difficult substance for people with disabilities to traverse, especially if those disabilities impact their physical movement, as in the case of wheelchairs, walkers, crutches.

# **ANALYSIS:**

The proposed playground project includes 100% rubber, poured in place, safety surfacing which allows for taller and faster structures, improves accessibility, and requires less maintenance. The playground equipment is also responsive to the feedback from Marina youth with taller structures, faster slides, swing options, climbers, natural materials, and more inclusive play options.

During the Fiscal Year 2023-24, 2024-25 budget process, the City Council approved Capital Improvement Project QLP 2112 for \$1,100,000 to replace existing playground equipment and surfacing, as well as purchase, and install a permanent restroom at Windy Hill Park (**EXHIBIT A**).

On June 18, 2024, the City Council passed and adopted Resolution 2024-73 selecting the preferred design (**EXHIBIT B**).

Staff will come back to Council for approval to purchase and install a new permanent restroom when the design and cost estimates are completed.

# **FISCAL IMPACT:**

No fiscal implications at this time.

The Windy Hill Park Playground Project is included in the Capital Improvement Program budget, QLP 2112 for \$1,100,000.

The cost of the playground, surfacing, and installation is \$981,660.46.

# **CONCLUSION:**

This request is submitted for City Council consideration and possible action.

# **BACKGROUND:**

On December 8, 2021, an on-site Marina community engagement workshop was held to ask local youth what they want to see in new playground equipment. Marina Youth and Teen Center members, as well as members of the Youth Commission participated. Participant feedback trended toward taller and faster slides, multiple swing options, climbers, use of natural materials, and more inclusive play options.

On February 27, 2023, another on-site Marina community engagement workshop was held to receive input on future playground options. There were 36 participants between the ages of 5-12. Feedback from this workshop was congruent with the previous workshop. Feedback trended toward taller structures, faster slides, swing options, and climbing options. This group also requested spinners and music options.

# **ANALYSIS:**

In FY20, the City Council approved Capital Improvement Project QLP 2016 to purchase and install playground equipment and surface material for Sea Haven Park. The current balance is \$1,800,000.00 (**EXHIBIT A**). Subsequently, the City Council approved transferring this playground equipment to be used at Glorya Jean Tate Park.

On June 18, 2024, the City Council passed and adopted Resolution 2024-73 selecting the preferred new design for playground equipment at Sea Haven Park (**EXHIBIT B**).

The approved design is based on the input from Marina youth including taller structures, faster slides, multiple swing options, climbers, use of natural materials and inclusive play options.

# **FISCAL IMPACT:**

No fiscal implications at this time.

The Sea Haven Playground Project is included in the Capital Improvement Program budget, QLP 2016 for \$1,800,000.

The cost of the playground, surfacing, and installation is \$1,045,696.63.

**CONCLUSION:** This request is submitted for City Council consideration and possible action.

# **REQUEST:**

It is requested that the City Council and Boards:

1. Consider receiving Investment Reports for the City of Marina, City of Marina as Successor Agency to the Marina Redevelopment Agency, and Preston Park Sustainable Community Non-Profit Corporation (PPSC-NPC) and Abrams B Non-Profit Corporation for the quarter ended June 30, 2024.

# **BACKGROUND:**

Cash Management. The City's aggregate cash and investments increased by \$6.8MM at the end of the quarter, primarily due to receipt of property tax revenues in April. The Successor Agency remained relatively flat. The Preston & Abrams Non-Profit Corporations ended the quarter with an increase of \$2.24MM as a result of the inclusion of the Abrams operating funds that were previously excluded. Consistent with the City's investment strategy of capital preservation, the City has continued to maintain significant cash with the Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF), where the yields have improved to 4.36% but are still lagging behind returns from US Treasury Bills that remain north of 5%. To optimize investment yields and further diversify into other financial institutions per the city's investment policy, a new investments account was opened in the first quarter of 2024, where all funds have been deployed in US Treasury Bills. Efforts to reposition investments from LAIF to other financial institutions are still underway. Changes to the City's investment portfolio for the last quarter are shown in Table I, Cash and Investments.

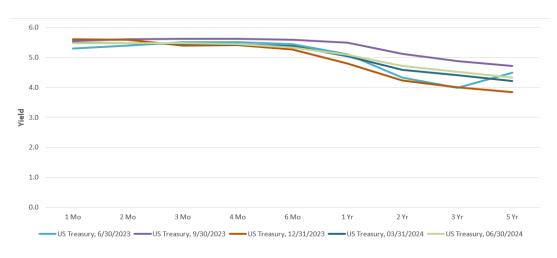

The quarterly LAIF interest rate was 4.36%, which represents a 0.24% increase from the previous quarter, as seen in Table I. <u>Chart I, Treasury Yield Curve</u> shows the treasury yield curve and its recent shift from June 2023 to June 2024. The Treasury Yield captures yield at various investment horizons. The chart demonstrates that short-term investments currently command higher yields than longer term investments.

Chart I, Treasury Yield Curve



Interest revenue is expected to outperform the previous year's investment revenue precisely due to this non-LAIF investment option, with has yielded above 5%. Interest revenue is allocated to all city funds, based on each funds respective fund balance. Nearly half of the city's interest revenue is allocated to the General Fund. Other significant funds, such as Fund 215 – Public Facilities Impact Fees, Fund 223 – FORA Dissolution Fund and Fund 422 – Measure X Capital Projects receive most of the remaining interest revenue. The city operates under an investment policy which can be found at: http://www.cityofmarina.org/26/Finance.

# Interest Rate / Economy.

The Federal Open Committee (FOMC) is the monetary policy making body of the Federal Reserve. They met five times this calendar year of 2024 (from January 1 to July 30<sup>th</sup>), but have maintained interest rates steady between 5.25% and 5.50% where it has stood since July 2023. Economists had widely predicted a series of four to five 25 basis point cuts in 2024, however, progress towards achieving a target rate of 2% inflation has stalled and the data has not supported the much-anticipated rate decrease. However, the Fed is now widely expected to cut the rate starting in September, a perception reinforced by Fed officials' acknowledgment of cooling inflation and a faltering job market. While note ruling it out, Chairman Powell has suggested a 50 basis-point move isn't planned, but perhaps 25 would be the start of the much-anticipated turning point.

Economically, the city is in a healthy position. Property tax revenues continue to experience a slight growth trajectory due to new development and increases in property values due to ownership transfers (real estate sales). Transient occupancy and sales tax revenues have recovered from the pandemic and continue to demonstrate reliable cash flow to the city that is consistent with expectations.

**Portfolio Strategy.** Staff's goal is to match or outperform LAIF. LAIF's quarterly performance was an ROI of 4.36%, whereas US Treasury Bills commanded above 5%, as shown in Chart I. City staff have established another investment account to shift funds from LAIF to higher performing securities.

# **ANALYSIS:**

The attached investment reports include the City of Marina's and the City of Marina as Successor Agency to the Marina Redevelopment Agency's and Preston & Abrams Non-Profit Corporation reports ("**EXHIBIT A**"). These include unreconciled balances of City, Successor Agency and Preston Park / Abrams Park investments held by financial institutions as reported in their monthly statements.

# **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Investing the City's in accordance with the City's primary investment objective of safety, liquidity and yield can earn respectable interest earnings for the City, City of Marina's and the City of Marina as Successor Agency to the Marina Redevelopment Agency.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 2024-07

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARINA AMENDING TITLE 2 OF THE MARINA MUNICIPAL CODE (ADMINISTRATION AND PERSONNEL) TO UPDATE TERMINOLOGY IN MARINA MUNICIPAL CODE FOR INCLUSIVITY: REPLACING 'COUNCILMAN' WITH 'COUNCILMEMBER'

WHEREAS, the Marina Municipal Code, Title 2, Administration and Personnel, currently uses the term "councilman" in Chapters 2.04 (City Council) and 2.08 (City Manager). These sections of the code have remained unchanged since 1975, reflecting an outdated and non-inclusive terminology that fails to represent the diverse composition of our community and modern-day governance; and

**WHEREAS,** to ensure that the language within our Municipal Code accurately reflects the diversity and inclusivity of our City Council, it is recommended that the term "councilman" be replaced with "councilmember"; and

**WHEREAS**, this change will encompass all genders and promote a more inclusive and equitable environment; updating the terminology is a simple yet significant step towards acknowledging and respecting the contributions of all individuals, regardless of gender, who serve on the City Council; and

WHEREAS, by making this amendment, we align our municipal code with contemporary values and practices, fostering a more welcoming and representative local government;

### NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARINA DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

#### **Section 1. Findings.**

The City Council finds and determines the recitals set forth above to be true and correct and by this reference, incorporates the same herein as findings.

**Section 2.** Title 2, Administration and Personnel, of the Marina City Code is hereby amended to read as follows. **Deleted items will be <del>double-stricken</del>**; amended or inserted items will be underlined and in red.

#### **Chapter 2.04 CITY COUNCIL**

#### 2.04.010 Meetings—Time.

The regular meetings of the city council shall be held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month convening at the hour of five p.m. if there is a closed session and convening in open session at six-thirty p.m. The time and date of <u>council</u> meetings may be set by resolution adopted by the council. (Ord. 2024-01 § 2, 2024; Ord. 2001-11 § 1, 2001; Ord. 78-12 § 1, 1978; Ord. 75-2 § 1, 1975)

#### 2.04.020 Meetings—Place.

The regular meetings of the city council shall be held at the Marina Community Center, 211 Hillcrest Avenue, Marina, California. (Ord. 75-2 § 2, 1975)

#### 2.04.030 Expenses—Reimbursement by city—Furnishing information.

A city eouncilman councilmember who intends to attend a convention, conference or meeting, or who is required to attend to city business in the discharge of his work, shall file with the city manager, on a form provided by the city, the following information: the date, the place and an itemized estimated expense statement and an estimated statement of any other expenditure believed to be necessary in connection with the business. A eouncilman councilmember may apply for expenses only in connection with the business. A eouncilman councilmember may apply for expenses only in connection with a meeting of expenses authorized in the annual budget. Expenses in connection with a meeting of city business not authorized in the budget may be reimbursed only after approval by the city council. (Ord. 75-9 § 1, 1975)

#### 2.04.040 Expenses—Advances.

- A. A city <del>councilman</del> <u>councilmember</u> may apply for and receive an advance of funds against his contemplated expenses upon approval by the city manager. Upon the <del>councilman's</del> <u>councilmember's</u> return to the city, he shall give a general itemized statement of expenditures.
- B. The city manager may determine a per diem rate, and if he does so, the per diem rate shall include all expenses except transportation and registration for a convention. If the city manager fixes a per diem rate, a councilment councilment attending upon city business is not entitled to any reimbursement or payment in excess of the per diem rate, except for transportation and registration and a convention and it is not necessary to submit an itemized statement of expenditures.
- C. The city manager is authorized to prepare the forms he considers necessary in order to administer this chapter. (Ord. 75-9 § 2, 1975)

#### 2.04.050 Expenses—City manager may grant exceptions.

The city manager may grant an exception or a variation to the requirements of this chapter when, in his judgment, an exception or variation is necessary, having in mind the economy of the city. The city council shall confirm each exception or variation granted by the city manager. (Ord. 75-9 § 3, 1975)

#### **Chapter 2.08 CITY MANAGER**

#### 2.08.010 Office created.

The office of the city manager is created. The city council shall appoint the city manager and shall make the appointment wholly on the basis of his administrative and executive ability and qualifications. The city manager shall hold office at the pleasure of the city council. (Ord. 75-8 § 1, 1975)

#### 2.08.030 Eligibility.

A member of the city council is not eligible for appointment as city manager until one year elapses after the councilmember ceases to be a member of the council. (Ord. 75-8 § 3, 1975)

#### 2.08.040 Bond.

The city manager shall furnish a corporate surety bond approved by the city council in such sum the city council determines. The bond shall be conditioned upon the faithful performance of the duties imposed upon the city manager. The premium for the bond is a proper charge against the city. (Ord. 75-8 § 4, 1975)

#### 2.08.050 Assistant city manager—Acting city manager.

The city council may also appoint an assistant city manager to serve as acting city manager during the temporary absence or disability of the city manager. If there is no assistant city manager, the city manager shall designate a qualified city employee to exercise the powers and perform the duties of city manager during his temporary absence or disability by filing a written notice with the city clerk or the deputy or assistant city clerk. If the city manager's absence or disability extends over a two-month period, the city council may appoint an acting city manager. (Ord. 75-8 § 5, 1975)

#### 2.08.060 Compensation.

- A. The city manager shall receive such compensation as the city council may determine from time to time.
- B. The city manager shall be reimbursed for all actual and necessary expenses incurred by him in the performance of his official duties.
- C. On termination of employment of the city manager by involuntary removal from service other than for wilful misconduct in office, the city manager shall receive cash severance pay in the lump sum equal to one month's pay for every year of continuous service or fraction as city manager, up to a total of four months' pay. The severance pay is computed at the highest salary received by the city manager during his service with the city. Involuntary removal from service shall include reduction in pay not applicable to all employees of the city. (Ord. 75-8 § 6, 1975)

#### 2.08.070 Powers and duties.

The city manager is the administrative head of the government of the city, subject to the direction and control of the city council. He is responsible for the efficient administration of all the affairs of the city which are under his control. In addition to his general powers as administrative head, and not as a limitation on them, the city manager shall:

A. Enforce the laws and ordinances of the city and see that the franchises, contracts, permits and privileges granted by the council are faithfully observed;

- B. Control, order and give directions to all heads of departments and to subordinate officers and employees of the city who are subject to removal by him;
- C. Appoint, remove, promote and demote each officer and employee of the city, excepting the city attorney, subject to personnel ordinances, rules and regulations;
- D. Conduct studies and effect such administrative reorganization of offices, positions and units under his direction as are in the interest of efficient, effective and economical conduct of the city's business;
- E. Recommend to the council for adoption such measures and ordinances as he considers necessary;
- F. Attend all meetings of the council unless he is excused by the mayor individually or the council, except when his removal is under consideration;
- G. Keep the council advised at all times as to the financial condition and needs of the city;
- H. Prepare and submit the proposed annual budget and the proposed salary plan to the council for its approval;
- I. See that no expenditures are submitted or recommended to the council except on approval of the city manager or his authorized representative. The city manager or his authorized representative is responsible for the purchase of all supplies for all the departments and divisions of the city;
- J. Make investigations into the affairs of the city and each department and division of it and each contract and its proper performance by the city. The city manager shall investigate all complaints of matters concerning the administration of the city government and of the service maintained by public utilities in the city;
- K. Exercise general supervision over all public buildings, public parks, and all other public property under the control and jurisdiction of the council;
- L. Perform such other duties and exercise such other powers as the city council may delegate to him from time to time. (Ord. 96-25 § 1(2), 1996; Ord. 75-8 § 7, 1975)

#### 2.08.080 Council-manager relations.

Each member of the city council shall deal with the administrative services of the city through the city manager, except for the purpose of inquiry. Neither the council nor a member of the council shall give orders or instructions to subordinates of the city manager. The city manager shall take his orders and instructions from the council only when the council is sitting in a duly convened meeting and no individual <del>councilman</del> <u>councilmember</u> shall give orders or instructions to the city manager. (Ord. 75-8 § 8, 1975)

#### 2.08.090 Departmental cooperation.

Each subordinate officer and the city clerk, city treasurer and the city attorney shall assist the city manager in administering the affairs of the city efficiently, economically and harmoniously. (Ord. 75-8 § 9, 1975)

#### 2.08.100 Attendance at commission meetings.

The city manager may, and upon request of the city council shall, attend meetings of the planning commission and other commissions, boards and committees created by the council. At these meetings which the city manager attends, boards or committees shall hear the city manager upon matters which he wishes to address the members, and he shall inform the members as to the status of matters being considered by the council. He shall cooperate to the fullest extent with the members of each commission, board and committee appointed by the council. (Ord. 75-8 § 10, 1975)

#### 2.08.110 Removal—Council vote—Notice.

The city manager may be removed only by a majority vote of the whole city council, as then constituted, convened in a regular council meeting, subject to

Sections <u>2.08.120</u> through <u>2.08.150</u> of this chapter. In case of his removal by the council, the council shall furnish the city manager with a written notice stating the council's intention to remove him at least thirty days before the effective date of his removal. If the city manager so requests, the council shall provide in writing reasons for the intended removal. The council shall provide the city manager with these written reasons within seven days after the receipt of a request from the city manager. The city manager shall make his request for the reasons in writing at least fifteen days before the effective date of his removal. (Ord. 75-8 § 11, 1975)

#### 2.08.120 Removal—Hearing.

Within seven days after the delivery to the city manager of the notice of intention to remove, the city manager may request a hearing before the council by filing written notice with the city clerk or deputy or assistant city clerk. Thereafter, the council shall fix a time for the hearing. The council shall hold the hearing at its usual meeting place, before the effective date of the intended removal. At the hearing the city manager may appear and be heard with or without counsel. The purpose of the hearing is to allow the city manager to present to the council his grounds of opposition to his removal before the council acts. (Ord. 75-8 § 12, 1975)

#### 2.08.130 Removal—Suspension pending hearing.

After furnishing the city manager with written notice of intended removal, the council may suspend him from duty, but his compensation continues until the effective date of his removal by action of the council taken after the hearing referred to in Section <u>2.08.120</u> of this chapter. (Ord. 75-8 § 13, 1975)

#### 2.08.140 Removal—Discretion of council.

In removing the city manager, the council has absolute discretion and its action is final and conclusive and does not depend upon any particular showing or degree of proof at the hearing. (Ord. 75-8 § 14, 1975)

#### 2.08.150 Removal—Limitations.

Notwithstanding Sections <u>2.08.110</u> through <u>2.08.140</u>, the city manager may not be removed from office, other than for misconduct in office, during the period of one hundred eighty days following: 1) a general municipal election held in the city at which a member of the city council is elected, or 2) the time when a new city <del>councilman</del> <u>councilmember</u> is appointed. The purpose of this section is to allow each newly elected or appointed member of the council or a

reorganized council to observe the actions and ability of the city manager in the performance of his powers and duties of his office. (Ord. 75-8 § 15, 1975)

#### 2.08.160 Agreements on employment.

This chapter is not a limitation on the power or authority of the city council to enter into a supplemental agreement with the city manager delineating additional terms and conditions of employment not inconsistent with this chapter. (Ord. 75-8 § 16, 1975)

**Section 3, Effective Date:** This Ordinance shall take effect and shall be in force thirty (30) days from and after adoption.

**Section 4, Posting of Ordinance:** Within fifteen (15) days of the adoption of this Ordinance, the City Clerk shall cause it to be posted in three (3) public places designated by Resolution of the City Council.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 2024-08**

# AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARINA, CALIFORNIA ESTABLISHING THE MARINA SPECIAL TAX DISTRICT FINANCING CODE AS CHAPTER 3.35 OF THE MARINA MUNICIPAL CODE

WHEREAS, the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, constituting Section 53311 et seq. of the California Government Code (the "Mello-Roos Act") allows for the financing of various facilities and services by means of the formation of community facilities districts and the levy of special taxes on property in the community facilities districts; and

WHEREAS, the City has been requested to form a community facilities district to finance the cost of services, including maintenance of certain facilities that will be owned by private entities and made available for access and use by the public; however, the Mello-Roos Act does not currently expressly allow for the financing of such costs; and

WHEREAS, because the City is a chartered city, it has the power to adopt its own laws governing its municipal affairs; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide a means to finance the cost of maintenance of privately-owned facilities that are available for public access and use, the City Council desires to add to the City's Municipal Code, as Chapter 3.35 thereof, the Marina Special Tax District Financing Code, which will incorporate the provisions of the Mello-Roos Act, but also include the power of a community facilities district to finance the cost of maintenance of certain facilities that will be owned by private entities and made available for access and use by the public, and otherwise modify certain provisions of the Mello-Roos Act to allow for a more efficient process to establish a special tax community facilities district.

#### THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARINA DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 3.35 is hereby added to the Marina Municipal Code as follows:

### Chapter 3.35 MARINA SPECIAL TAX DISTRICT FINANCING CODE

#### Sections:

3.35.010	Findings and intent.
3.35.020	Incorporation of Mello-Roos Act.
3.35.030	Additional Powers of Community Facilities Districts.
3.35.040	Provisions of Mello-Roos Act that are not applicable.
3.35.050	Provisions of the Mello-Roos Act that are modified.

#### 3.35.010 Findings and Intent.

- (A) The City Council finds that the provision of publicly-accessible community spaces in the City of Marina and other publicly-accessible facilities is of primary importance to the health and welfare of the residents of the City of Marina; and that the provision of such community spaces and facilities and restrooms is sometimes more efficiently provided by private property owners and community associations; and that the provision of publicly-accessible community spaces and publicly-accessible facilities and restrooms is a municipal purpose.
- (B) The City Council finds that the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, constituting Sections 53311 et seq. of the California Government Code (the "Mello-Roos Act") provides for the financing of certain public improvements and municipal services needed for developing areas in the State of California, but does not expressly provide for the financing of the cost of maintenance of privately-owned facilities being made available for access and use by the public pursuant to a contractual agreement with the City of Marina, recorded covenants, conditions and restrictions or conditions of land use entitlements.
- (C) The City Council desires to provide a means to finance the cost of maintenance of privately-owned facilities being made available for access and use by the public pursuant to a contractual agreement with the City of Marina, recorded covenants, conditions and restrictions or conditions of land use entitlements, and to otherwise provide for an efficient means to form community facilities districts under the Mello-Roos Act, as included in this Chapter 3.35 and as otherwise supplemented and amended hereby.

#### 3.35.020 Incorporation of Mello-Roos Act.

- (A) Except as provided in this Chapter 3.35, the provisions of the Mello-Roos Act are by this reference incorporated herein.
- (B) In the event of any conflict between the provisions of this Chapter 3.35 and the provisions of the Mello-Roos Act or any other provision of law, the provisions of this Chapter 3.35 shall prevail.

#### 3.35.030 Additional Powers of Community Facilities Districts.

(A) In addition to the services authorized to be financed by a community facilities district as described in Section 53313 of the Mello-Roos Act, a community facilities district formed under the provisions of this Chapter 3.35 may finance: Maintenance and lighting of publicly-accessible plazas and courtyards, including landscaping and public art, and publicly-accessible restroom facilities, including such areas and facilities that are owned by a private entity, if the facilities are made accessible to the public pursuant to a contractual agreement with the City of Marina, recorded covenants, conditions and restrictions or conditions of land use entitlements.

#### 3.35.040 Provisions of Mello-Roos Act that are not applicable.

- (A) Notwithstanding Section 3.35.020, the following provisions of the Mello-Roos Act shall not apply to community facilities districts formed under the authority of this Chapter 3.35, or otherwise to extensions of authorized facilities and services, changes in special taxes, annexations of territory, levies of special taxes, or the incurrence of bonded indebtedness with respect to community facilities districts formed under the authority of this Section 3.35 (all references below to Sections are to Sections of the California Government Code, as in effect on the date of adoption by the City Council of Ordinance No. 2024-08): (i) Section 53312; (ii) Section 53332; (iii) Section 53333; and (iv) Section 53343.1.
- (B) In addition to the foregoing, the portions of the following provisions of the Mello-Roos Act shall not apply to community facilities districts formed under the authority of this Chapter 3.35 (all references below to Sections are to Sections of the California Government Code, as in effect on the date of adoption by the City Council of Ordinance No. 2024-08):
  - (i) the second to last paragraph of Section 53313; and
  - (ii) the last sentence of Section 53326(b).

#### 3.35.050 Provisions of Mello-Roos Act that are modified.

- (A) Notwithstanding Section 3.35.020, the following provisions of the Mello-Roos Act shall apply, as modified as set forth below, to community facilities districts formed under the authority of this Chapter 3.35, or otherwise to extensions of authorized facilities and services, changes in special taxes, annexations of territory, levies of special taxes, or the incurrence of bonded indebtedness with respect to community facilities districts formed under the authority of this Section 3.35 (all references below to Sections are to Sections of the California Government Code, as in effect on the date of adoption by the City Council of Ordinance No. 1479):
  - (i) the reference to "not less than 30" in Section 53321(e) is hereby modified to be "not less than 10;"
  - (ii) the reference to "at least 90 days" in Section 53326(a) is hereby modified to be "at least 45 days;"
  - (iii) the reference to "not be less than 30" in Section 53334 and in Section 53339.3 is hereby modified to be "not to be less than 10;"
  - (iv) the reference to "pursuant to this chapter" in Section 53340(d) is hereby modified to be "pursuant to the Mello-Roos Act or Chapter 3.35 of the Marina Municipal Code;" and

(v) the reference to "authorized by this chapter" in Section 53343 is hereby modified to be "authorized by the Mello-Roos Act or Chapter 3.35 of the Marina Municipal Code."

SECTION 2. Severability. If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase in this Ordinance or any part thereof is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid or ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or any part thereof. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one (1) or more subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional, or invalid, or ineffective, provided the basic purposes of this Ordinance and the benefits to the City and the public are not substantially impaired.

**SECTION 3.** The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this ordinance and shall cause this ordinance to be published or posted as required by law.

CITY COUNCIL TO CONSIDER TAKING CERTAIN ACTIONS, INCLUDING ADOPTING RESOLUTION NO. 2024- AND OPENING A PUBLIC HEARING, INTRODUCING AND ADOPTING ORDINANCE NO. 2024-, ALL TO ORDER A GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND ELECTION, ESTABLISH SPECIFICATIONS, REQUEST CONSOLIDATION WITH OTHER ELECTIONS OCCURRING ON NOVEMBER 5, 2024, AND AUTHORIZE NECESSARY ACTIONS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the City Council:

- 1. Adopt Resolution No. 2024-, a resolution of the City Council of the City of Marina ordering a General Obligation Bond Election, establishing specifications, requesting consolidation with other elections occurring on November 5, 2024, and authorizing necessary actions in connection therewith; and
- 2. Open a public hearing, introduce and adopt Ordinance No. 2024-, an ordinance of the City Council of the City of Marina ordering a General Obligation Bond Election, establishing specifications, requesting consolidation with other elections occurring on November 5, 2024, and authorizing necessary actions in connection therewith.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The City's population has more than doubled since the City was incorporated in 1975, but still relies on the same aging and deteriorating fire stations, police station, and city facilities that were built for a much smaller population.

More than 80 percent of all 911 calls to the Marina Fire Department are medical emergencies, such as heart attacks, strokes, and car accidents, and seconds matter in a life-threatening situations, but because aging fire stations are located far from many Marina residents, response times for some areas of the City are close to 10 minutes, much slower than the 5-minute national standard.

The City's aging fire and police stations do not meet current earthquake safety standards and could collapse and prevent first responders from getting to residents in a major earthquake. The current fire stations are too small to accommodate modern technology and life-saving equipment, such as rescue equipment and a ladder truck, to keep the City safe.

Many essential city programs and services are delivered from deteriorating portable buildings that were installed nearly 50 years ago and were intended to be temporary, are not accessible for residents with disabilities, have mold, asbestos, leaky roofs, are not earthquake safe, and do not provide space to support local services.

The City's deteriorating community center, which includes the community center, city council chambers, community rooms, recreation and City offices is not up to current earthquake, fire safety and ADA standards; yet these buildings are used every day by the City's daycare, preschool, before/ afterschool programs; other youth, family, and senior programs; recreation and city employees and the public.

The cost to upgrade Marina's aging facilities is beyond what the City's current budget can support and the City Council believes that locally controlled funding from a bond measure is needed to construct a new fire station, police station, and community center.

A bond measure for a fire station, police station, and community center would require strict fiscal accountability protections including public disclosure of all spending, an independent oversight committee, and annual audits.

All funds from a local bond measure must stay under local control, may only be used for facilities to improve essential services in Marina and cannot be taken away by the State.

#### **ANALYSIS**:

#### Roesling Nakamura Terada (RNT) Architects

The City contracted with RNT Architects in February 2024 initially to assist the city in identifying suitable sites for construction of police, fire, and community facilities; assess the feasibility of these sites to support the needed functions; and provide a high-level layout of buildings including needed square footage for each facility with estimated costs per facility. In June 2024, the scope was expanded to include an assessment of the existing condition of the police, fire, and community center facilities.

The site assessment included looking at the following sites:

- Community center (Hillcrest Ave)
- Locke Paddon Park (Seaside Circle)
- MST Transit Center (Reservation Road)
- Vince DiMaggio Park (Del Monte Blvd)
- Cypress Knolls (California Ave)

The site assessment looked at ownership & availability of the land; zoning & current use; condition & topography; accessibility & parking; fit of building on the site; connection to community; and financial feasibility.

Additionally, the assessment included a needs survey and interviews conducted to determine specific workspace needs and future staffing projections. (**EXHIBIT A**)

After receiving public comment on the proposed various sites, the City Council decided that multiple sites would work well and that for now, rather than focus limited time on selecting final sites for the facilities, the focus would be on the General Obligation Bond including what facilities would be included in the bond and the bond amount. A more engaged process with the public identifying the specific sites for the police, fire and community center facilities will happen later if the bond is approved.

The final facility needs assessment determined there are specific space deficits across all city departments, including core operational shortcomings in the police and fire facility and shortage of meeting space and training rooms. The police department's current space needs are 13,000 square feet and the current facility is 5,070 square feet. The fire department's current space needs are 17,000 square feet and the current facility is 7,600 square feet. Community center space needs are 17,500 square feet and the current facility is 10,700 square feet. The per capita square footage needs for all facilities were far below the standards for cities the size of Marina with the same operational demands.

The facility condition assessment looked at the as-built documentation in the buildings; site evaluation of the roof and underneath; evaluation of age, structure, envelope, interior, systems, ADA, reuse, and expansion potential; and comparing repair versus replacement. (**EXHIBIT B**)

#### The study concluded:

- Public Safety Building: Reuse of the current public safety facility is not suitable for public safety and essential services functions. The overall condition of the building is good, and it can be repaired, retrofitted, and remodeled for possible other city uses.
- Annex Building: While the condition of the current city annex (community development & public works) building is good, this building is not suited for city office use.
- City Hall: This building is at the end of its useful lifecycle. Significant repairs of fundamental parts and needed. Structural system offers no flexibility or expansion potential.
- City Council Chamber: The condition of this building is fair. Major repairs and upgrades are needed. While structural systems offer some flexibility, there is no expansion potential.

RNT also provided the follow cost estimates for constructing new city facilities:

- Police Department \$17.5 million
- Fire Station \$16 million
- Community Center \$21.5 million
- Total \$55 million

#### Fairbank, Maslin, Maullin, Metz & Associates (FM3)

The survey research firm FM3 was hired through Team CivX the consultant hired by the City to assist with community outreach and public education regarding a potential General Obligation bond measure. FM3 conducted a survey on the opinions of local funding for public facilities for the City of Marina. The survey interviewed 329 of the likely voters for the November 2024 election and conducted the survey through telephone and online interviews. (**EXHIBIT C**)

#### The survey concluded:

- There are quite positive views of the direction of the City, the quality of life that is available in Marina, the City's public safety agencies and the management of the City.
- A substantial majority also perceives a need for additional funding, but less so than the survey conducted in 2022.
- An \$80 million bond measure for Marina's public safety buildings, community buildings and recreation facilities does not have a good likelihood of success for the November 2024 ballot.
- Even after providing robust information about the purpose and benefits of the measure, it does not reach the 55% threshold which may be established through a statewide ballot measure at the same election.
- Voters more strongly value the potential impacts of upgrades to public safety buildings than they see the benefits of upgrading recreation and aquatic facilities.
- In both cases, it is the outcomes of the investments that are priorities for voters not the upgrades to the facilities themselves. These include:
  - o Maintaining 911, fire and emergency medical response times
  - Ensuring the fire and police departments can respond to emergencies and natural disasters.
  - o Ensuring emergency services are operational during an earthquake
  - o Recruiting and retaining qualified firefighters
- A small plurality of voters would be more likely to support a smaller bond measure that did not include the recreational and aquatic facilities, but not enough to boost the measure to the two-thirds level.

- If the Council chooses to proceed with a bond measure despite the clear challenges, it is recommended that the measure be limited to public safety facilities with a smaller bond authorization amount and tax rate.
- Further, significant community informational efforts and stakeholder outreach will be necessary, and if it is well-executed, it may boost the measure beyond the 55% threshold, but it is still very unlikely to reach the two-thirds level.
- Voters can best be reached on local TV news, city mailers, Facebook and Next-door, but use several different communication channels for news and information.

#### General Obligation Bond Cost

The City's financial advisor, Fieldman Rolapp analyzed potential General Obligation bond scenarios. (**EXHIBIT D**). The assumptions are based on fiscal year 2024 assessed valuation in Marina with the median accessed value for a single-family home at \$496,962. These bond scenarios are based on a 30-year bond with an approximate interest rate of 5%.

A \$50 million bond would cost the average median single-family home in Marina \$54.74 per \$100,000 of assessed value. This would be about \$22.67 per month and \$272.03 annually for the average home in Marina. The higher accessed value million-dollar homes would pay more and the lower than median would pay less.

#### Resolution of Public Interest and Necessity

On July 2, 2024, the City Council adopted, by a two-thirds vote of all the members, a Resolution entitled "A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Marina, California, determining that the public interest and necessity demand the construction of certain municipal improvements and making related findings. (**EXHIBIT E**)

#### July 23, 2024, Special City Council Meeting

The City has had numerous community and public meetings since 2021 discussing the need to address the city's critical facilities and public infrastructure deficits including police and fire station, community center, council chambers, and city offices. This outreach concluded with a Special City Council meeting held on July 23, 2024, with on open house from 4:00-6:00 and a City Council Study Session starting at 6:00 and concluding after 10:00pm. Presentations were made by the city manager, police chief, fire chief and RNT architects that covered the following topics:

- Facility needs assessment review
- Facility costs estimates
- Facility potential locations
- Sports and aquatic center options
- Emergency and fire response time and impacts on life safety
- Police department operational deficits and impact on critical police functions due to inadequate facilities

After receiving extensive public comment and discussion, the City Council directed staff to bring back to the City Council for consideration at the August 7 City Council meeting a measure to place a \$50 million-dollar General Obligation bond on the November 2024 ballot. This measure would provide for the construction of a new fire and police station and a community center including city council chambers and community rooms.

In order to order the submission of the proposition of incurring a bonded debt for the purpose set forth in said resolution to the qualified voters of the city at an election held for that purpose, the City Council must adopt a resolution and an ordinance ordering a general obligation bond election, establishing specifications, requesting consolidation with other elections occurring on November 5, 2024, and authorizing necessary actions in connection therewith. (**EXHIBIT F & G**)

The proposed ballot language is as follows:

MARINA 911 EMERGENCY RESPONSE, SAFETY, ESSENTIAL SERVICES/ FACILITIES MEASURE. To maintain rapid 911, fire, and emergency response times; ensure Marina's Fire/ Police Departments can respond to emergencies, maintain fire/police services, provide local fire/police stations/community center, shall City of Marina's measure authorizing \$50,000,000 in bonds at legal rates, levying on average \$54.74 per \$100,000 of assessed value, generating approximately \$3,191,000 annually while bonds are outstanding, be adopted, requiring public spending disclosure, all funds spent locally?

The City will use bond funds for the following projects:

- Construction of a new fire and police station to maintain rapid 911 emergency response times, disaster and emergency response, and fire and police services.
- Construction of a community center to provide safe places for children to play, delivery of city programs and services, and space for public and community meetings.

The ballot language is limited to seventy-five (75) words and at this point we are at the 75-word limit. The Council can potentially modify the ballot language, but we are limited by the word limit and certain statutory requirements.

The City Council also needs to select two councilmembers who will prepare and file a written argument in favor of the Measure and the rebuttal to the argument against the Measure (if any).

The following link provides access to city documents regarding the need to address critical city facility needs and the potential General Obligation bond measure going back to 2021.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**:

If the authorization is received from the voters at the November 5, 2024, election, all costs of the projects will be funded from the proceeds of bonds sold by the City and all debt service requirements of the bonds will be paid by City property owners by an ad valorem tax added to the tax roll.

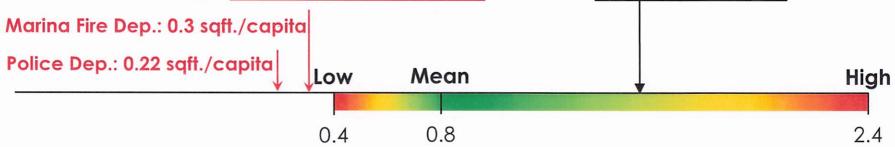

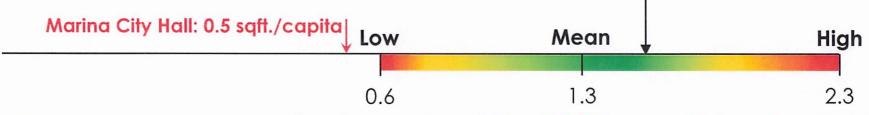


# Facility Needs Assessment - sqft./capita

• Public Service: Marina status quo versus typical range

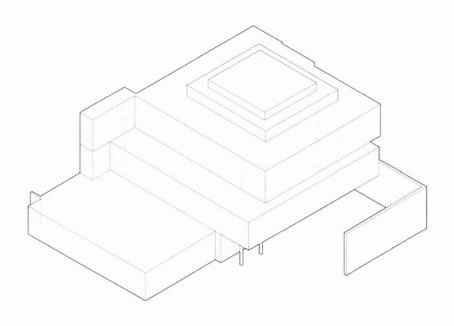

Do you think things in the City of Marina are headed in the right direction or are they off on the wrong track?







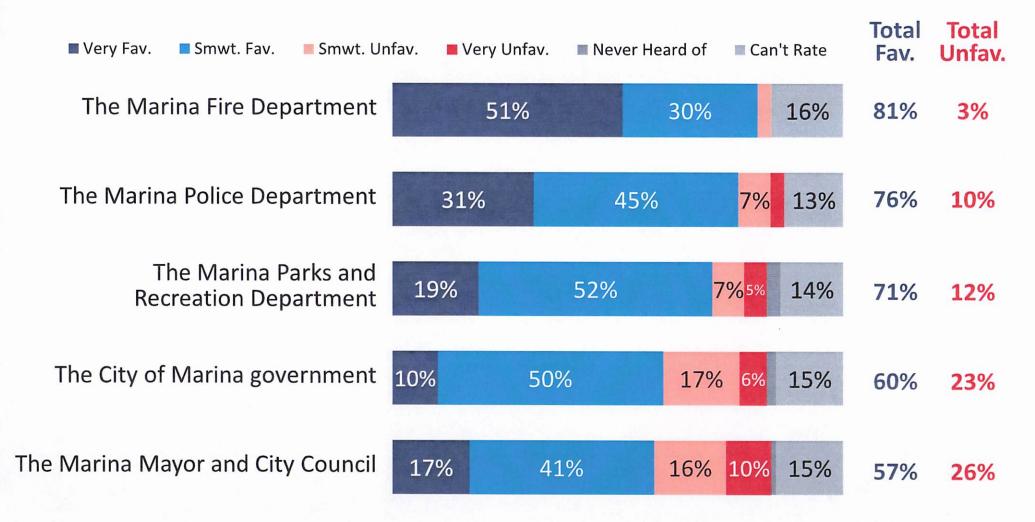

# Voters have strongly favorable views of Marina's public safety agencies.

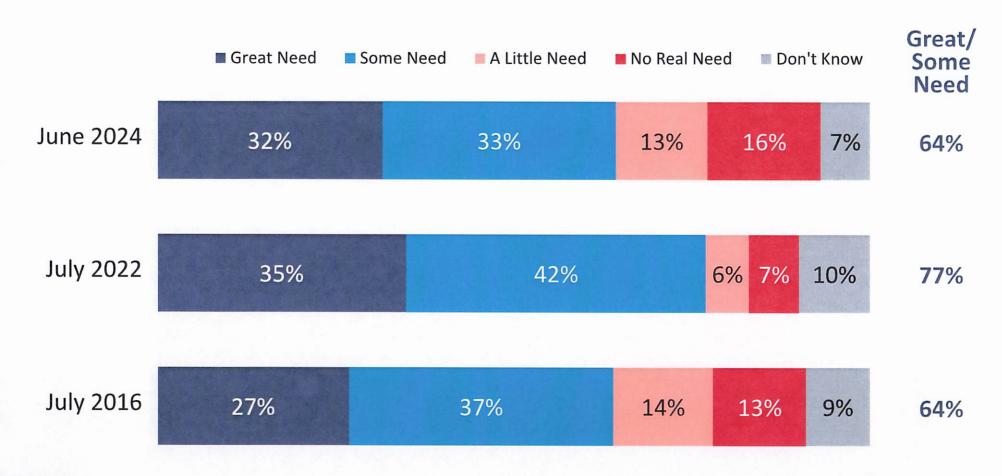

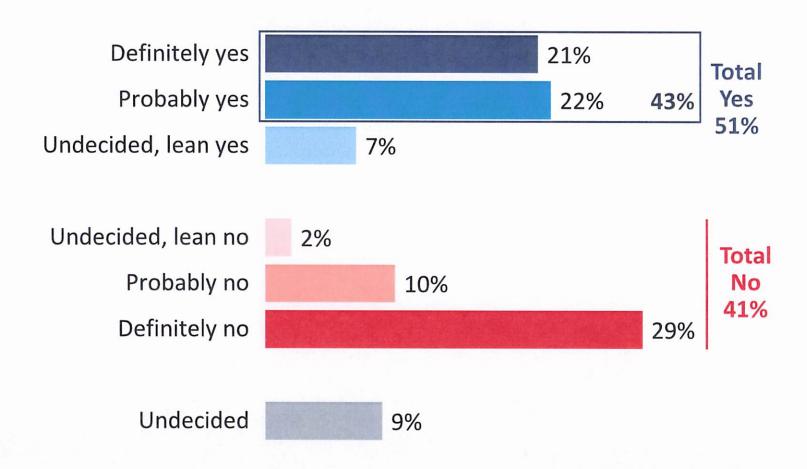

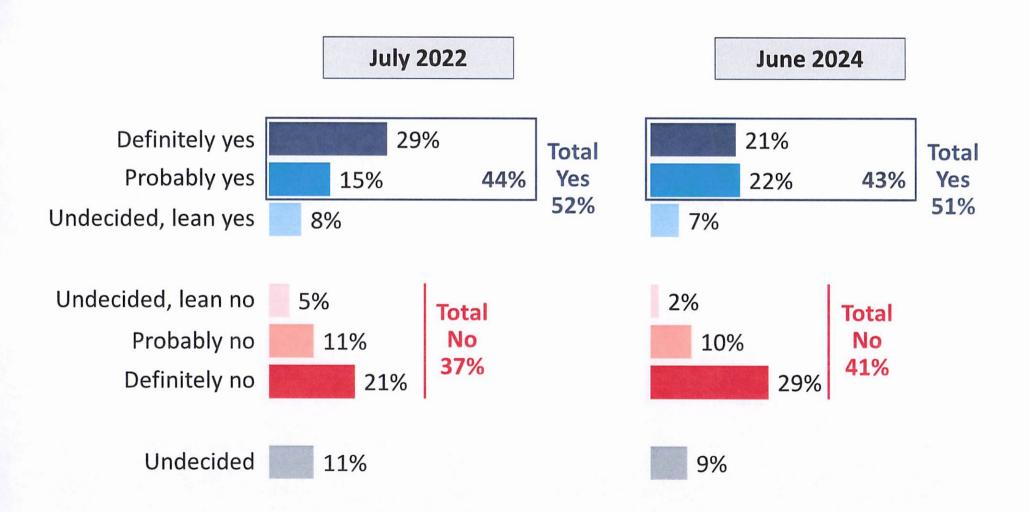

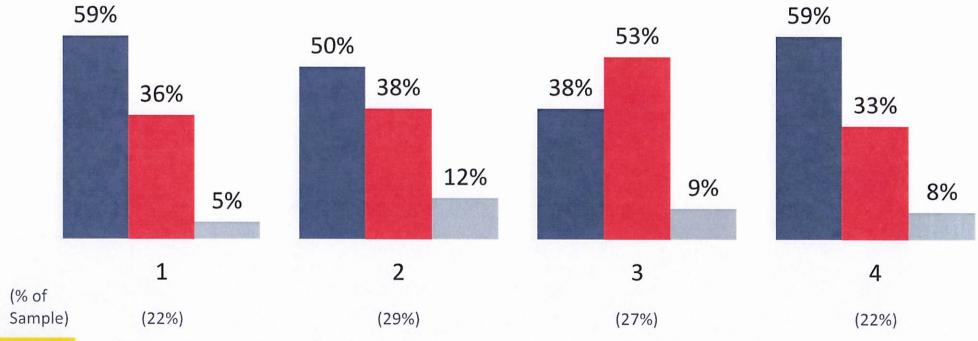

Initial Vote by City Council District



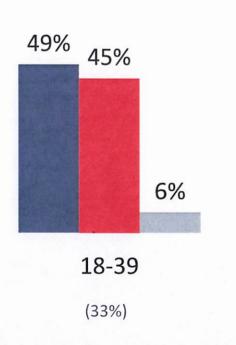


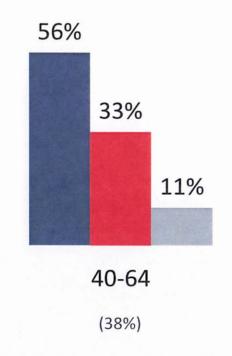


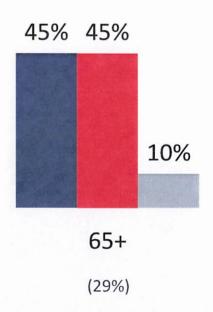

Initial Vote by Residence









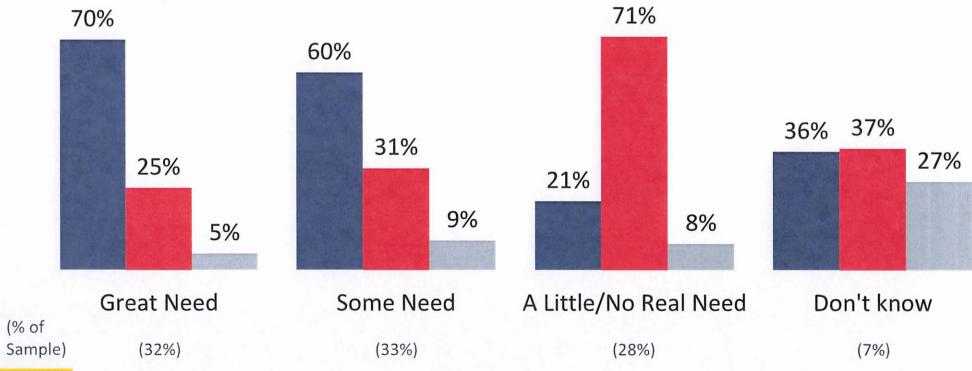

Initial Vote by Need for Funding

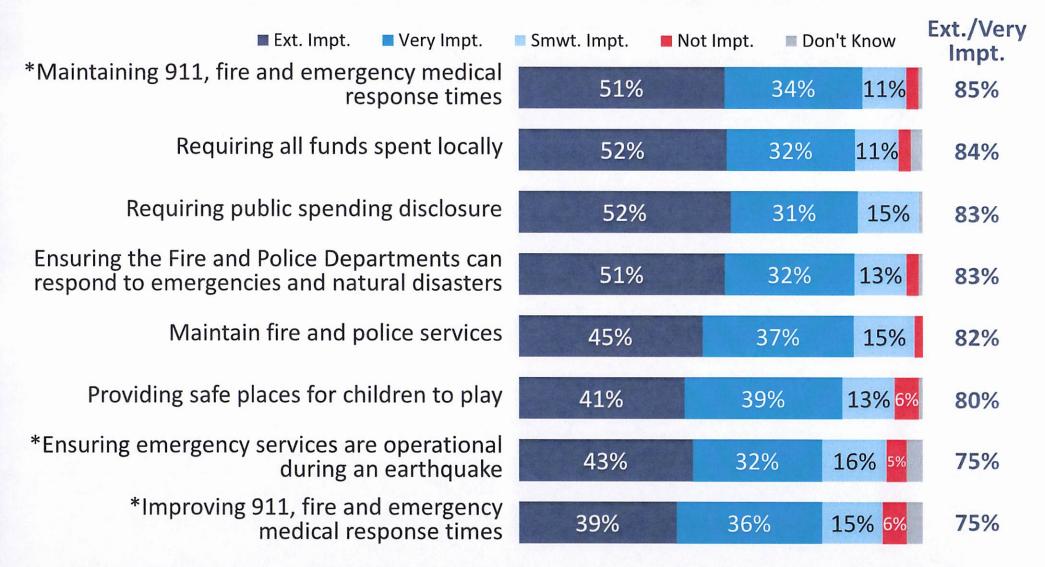

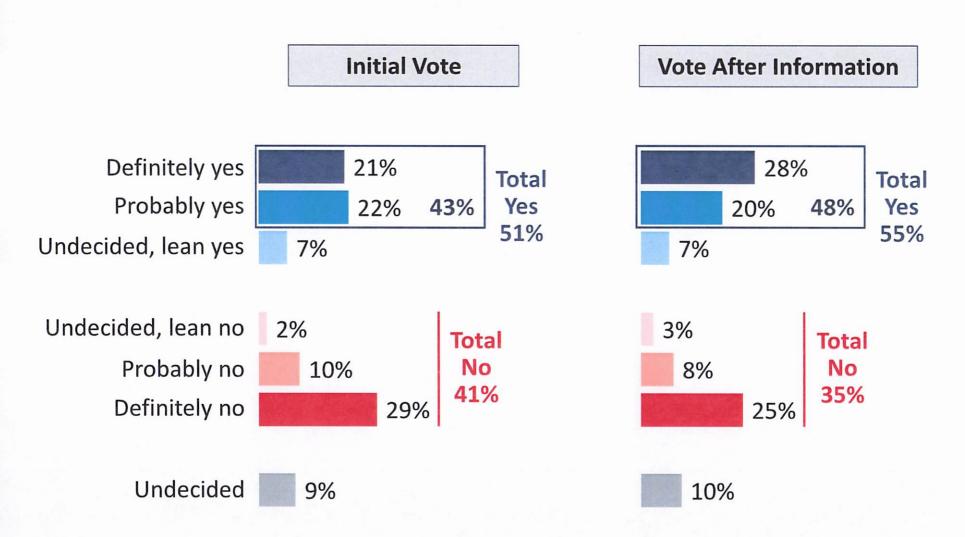

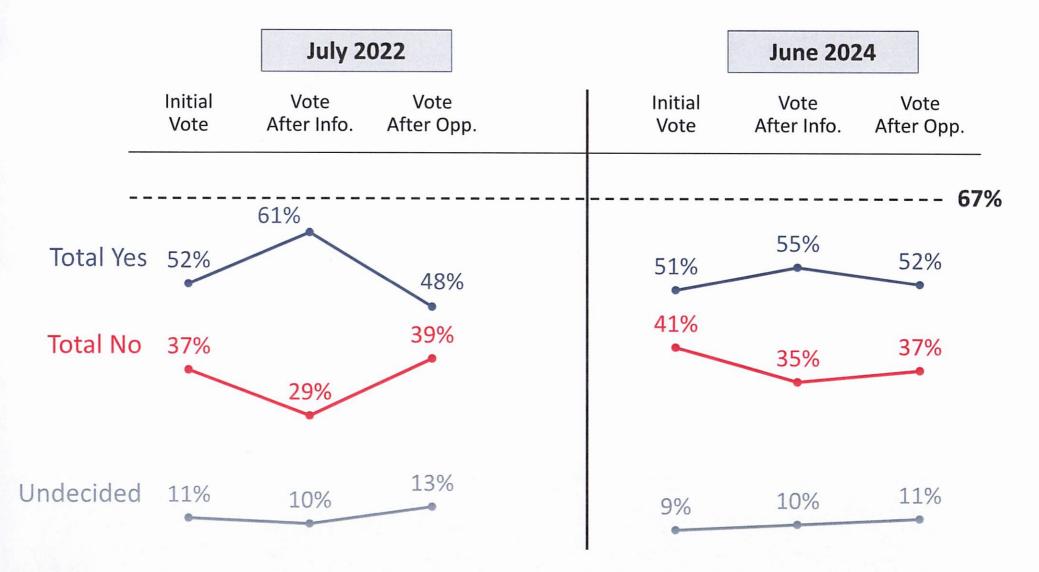


# Just over half of voters favor the measure after the back-and-forth of information and opposition.





# In 2022, support for the measure grew more significantly with information, but dropped further after opposition.





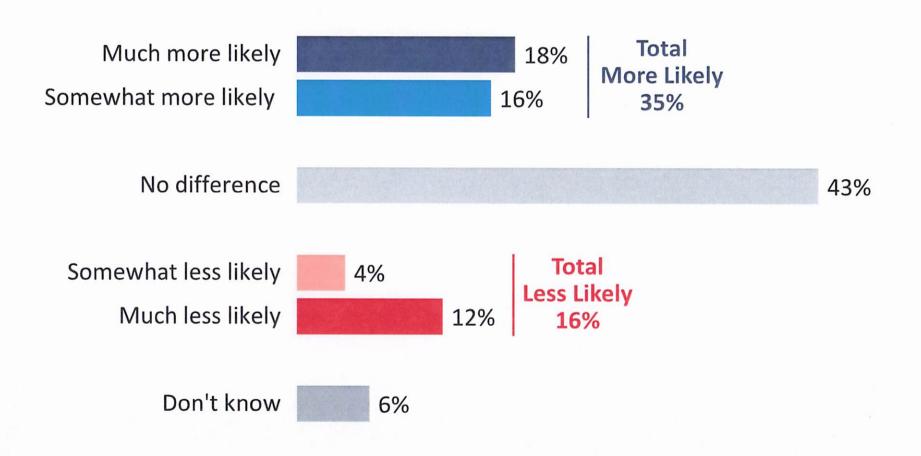
# **Background on Aquatic and Recreation Centers**

When Fort Ord was closed 30 years ago, the City of Marina received Fort Ord's pool and gym buildings. However, the City has not had the funds needed to make the extensive repairs required to open the facilities to residents. This measure would finally allow the City to restore the indoor aquatic and recreation facilities to provide children a safe place to play, meet the recreation needs of our community, and improve the quality of life in our city. Without this funding, the City may have to tear down these vacant buildings to prevent them from falling into greater disrepair.

But, if this measure did <u>not</u> include repairing the former Fort Ord aquatic and recreation facilities, the cost of the measure could be reduced from \$88 per \$100,000 of assessed value to \$65 per \$100,000 of assessed value. If the measure did not include the aquatics and recreation facilities, and the measure's cost was \$65 per \$100,000 of assessed value, would you be more or less likely to vote in favor of the measure or would it not make a difference one way or the other?



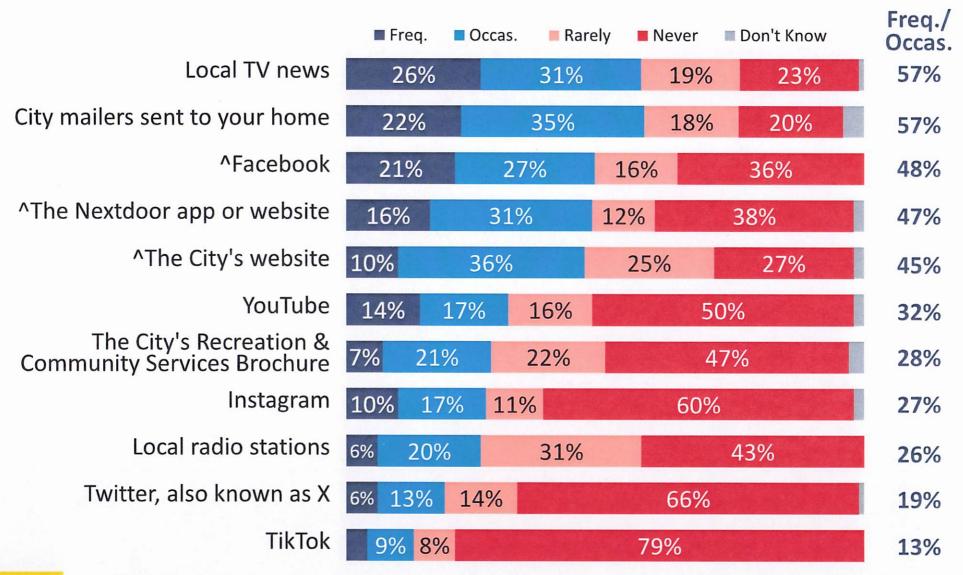

# **Conclusions**

## **Conclusions**

- There are quite positive views of the direction of the City, the quality of life that is available in Marina, the City's public safety agencies and the management of the City.
- A substantial majority also perceives a need for additional funding, but less so than in 2022.
- An \$80 million bond measure for Marina's public safety buildings, community buildings and recreation facilities does not have a good likelihood of success for the November 2024 ballot.
- Even after providing robust information about the purpose and benefits of the measure, it does not reach the 55% threshold which <u>may</u> be established through a statewide ballot measure at the same election.



## **Conclusions; Continued**

- Voters more strongly value the potential impacts of upgrades to public safety buildings than they see the benefits of upgrading recreation and aquatic facilities.
- In both cases, it is the outcomes of the investments that are priorities for voters – not the upgrades to the facilities themselves. These include:
  - Maintaining 911, fire and emergency medical response times
  - Ensuring the Fire and Police Departments can respond to emergencies and natural disasters
  - Ensuring emergency services are operational during an earthquake
  - Recruiting and retaining qualified firefighters
- A small plurality of voters would be more likely to support a smaller bond measure that did not include the recreational and aquatic facilities, but not enough to boost the measure to the two-thirds level.



## **Conclusions; Continued**

- If the Council chooses to proceed with a bond measure despite the clear challenges, it is recommended that the measure be limited to public safety facilities with a smaller bond authorization amount and tax rate.
- Further, significant community informational efforts and stakeholder outreach will be necessary, and if it is well-executed, it may boost the measure beyond the 55% threshold, but it is still very unlikely to reach the two-thirds level.
- Voters can best be reached on local TV news, City mailers, Facebook and Next Door, but use several different communication channels for news and information.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2024-85**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARINA, DETERMINING THAT THE PUBLIC INTEREST AND NECESSITY DEMAND THE CONSTRUCTION OF CERTAIN MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENTS AND MAKING FINDINGS RELATING THERETO

RESOLVED, by the City Council (the "Council") of the City of Marina (the "City") as follows:

WHEREAS, when Marina first became a city in 1975, a few temporary, portable buildings were set up to operate as the City Hall offices. The plan was to replace them in about six months. But, nearly 50 years later those temporary portable buildings are still being used to house City services, despite the fact that they are deteriorating, are not accessible for residents with disabilities, are undersized, unsafe, and structurally unsound. The current facilities pose safety risks and are inadequate to meet the needs of Marina's residents;

WHEREAS, the population of the City has grown substantially since the public safety building was built for combined police and fire services in 1993. The current building is too small to accommodate the modern technology and life-saving equipment, such as rescue equipment and a ladder truck, to keep the City safe;

WHEREAS, more than 80 percent of all 9-1-1 calls to the Marina Fire Department are medical emergencies, such as heart attacks, strokes, and car accidents. Seconds matter in a life-threatening situation, but because aging fire stations are located far from many Marina residents, response times for some areas of the City are close to 10 minutes, much slower than the 5-minute national standard;

WHEREAS, the City's aging fire, police station and emergency response center are not up to earthquake safety standards. If these stations collapse in an earthquake, first responders may not be able to get to residents in need.

WHEREAS, the City lacks the indoor recreation centers that are common in nearby communities, and has an existing unusable recreation and aquatic center transferred to the city from the Army in 1999, that if renovated would provide year-round recreation, swimming, and other safe activities for children, teens, families, and seniors;

WHEREAS, the City only has one, undersized, deteriorating community space, which is not up to earthquake and fire safety standards, has a leaky roof, yet this space is packed every day by the City's daycare, pre-school, before and after school programs, and other youth programs; senior programs, community exercise classes, and community events.

WHEREAS, assessment of the buildings conducted by outside consultants show repairing these buildings would cost nearly as much as replacing them, and even then, the restored facilities would be undersized and inadequate for Marina's population.

WHEREAS, Council has determined that the public interest and necessity demand construction and completion by the City of police, fire and community facilities and has determined that asking City voters for the authority to issue bonds to finance such projects;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Marina, California that:

#### Section 1. Findings and Determinations.

- (a) Based upon professional staff and consultant study and evaluation, the Council finds that the public interest and necessity demand the construction and completion by the City of Marina police, fire and community facilities.
- (b) The estimated cost of the municipal improvements set forth in Section 1(a) is up to \$80,000,000, which will be provided through a general obligation bond. The construction and completion of the municipal improvements requires an expenditure greater than available in the City's current budget and will require the issuance of a bond therefore, and such issuance is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes and powers of the City.
- (c) Passing a bond measure will allow the City to have the facilities and staff needed for a community its size. This measure would provide a place for the City's growing number of seniors to take fitness classes, stay active and healthy, and for youth and adults to exercise and play indoor sports without traveling to other cities and would provide a swim facility for City residents, including the Marina High School swim team. It is a good investment in our community's long-term health and quality of life. The measure would allow the City to provide a safe community space adequate for our residents' needs. The measure would allow for additional facility space for staffing and the life-saving equipment we currently lack to meet more of our population's needs and respond to multiple emergencies at the same time. The measure would locate an additional fire station where it is most needed and allow firefighters on duty each day to respond faster to emergencies throughout the city when seconds count. The measure will ensure that emergency services remain operational and reliable in a major earthquake.
- Section 2. Fiscal Accountability. The expenditure of bond proceeds to construct the proposed improvements will be subject to strict financial accountability requirements, including review of all expenditures of bond proceeds by a citizens' oversight committee, and annual reports. The citizens' oversight committee, composed of citizens appointed by the Council, will ensure the bond proceeds are spent for their authorized purposes, and will submit a written report to the Council and the public on the bond expenditures.
- Section 3. No Administrators' Salaries. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds authorized by the City's measure shall be used only to construct, repair and replace the public improvements specified in the measure, and not for any other purpose, including administrators' salaries or other operating expenses. By law, all funds can only be spent on municipal improvements.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2024-**

#### A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARINA ORDERING A GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND ELECTION, ESTABLISHING SPECIFICATIONS, REQUESTING CONSOLIDATION WITH OTHER ELECTIONS OCCURRING ON NOVEMBER 5, 2024, AND AUTHORIZING NECESSARY ACTIONS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

RESOLVED, by the City Council (the "Council") of the City Marina (the "City"), within Monterey County, California (the "County"), as follows:

WHEREAS, the City's population has more than doubled since the City was incorporated in 1975, but still relies on the same aging and deteriorating fire stations, police station, and city facilities that were built for a much smaller population;

WHEREAS, more than 80 percent of all 9-1-1 calls to the Marina Fire Department are medical emergencies, such as heart attacks, strokes, and car accidents, and seconds matter in a life-threatening situations, but because aging fire stations are located far from many Marina residents, response times for some areas of the City are close to 10 minutes, much slower than the 5-minute national standard;

WHEREAS, the City's aging fire and police stations (emergency response center) do not meet current earthquake safety standards, and could collapse and prevent first responders from getting to residents in a major earthquake;

WHEREAS, the current fire stations are too small to accommodate the modern technology and life-saving equipment, such as rescue equipment and a ladder truck, to keep the City safe;

WHEREAS, many essential city programs and services are delivered from deteriorating portable buildings that were installed nearly 50 years ago and were intended to be temporary, are not accessible for residents with disabilities, have mold, asbestos, leaky roofs, are not earthquake safe, and do not provide space to support local services;

WHEREAS, the City's deteriorating community center, which includes the community center, city council chambers, community rooms, recreation and City offices is not up to current earthquake, fire safety and ADA standards; yet this space is packed every day by the City's daycare, pre-school, before/ afterschool programs, and other youth, family, and senior programs; and recreation and city employees and the public;

WHEREAS, the cost to upgrade Marina's aging facilities is beyond what the City's current budget can support and the City Council believes that locally controlled funding from a bond measure is needed to construct a new fire station, police station, and community center;

WHEREAS, a bond measure for a fire station, police station, and community center would require strict fiscal accountability protections including public disclosure of all spending, an independent oversight committee, and annual audits;

WHEREAS, all funds from a local bond measure must stay under local control, may only be used for facilities to improve essential services in Marina and cannot be taken away by the State;

WHEREAS, on July 2, 2024, this Council adopted, by a two-thirds vote of all the members of this Council, a Resolution entitled "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARINA, CALIFORNIA, DETERMINING THAT THE PUBLIC INTEREST AND NECESSITY DEMAND THE CONSTRUCTION OF CERTAIN MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENTS AND MAKING FINDINGS RELATING THERETO;"

WHEREAS, in order to provide for the issuance by the City of general obligation bonds to finance the acquisition or improvement of real property to repair or replace the City's aging fire, police station and emergency response center (as further described below and in Exhibit A, the "Projects"), it is necessary for this Council to pass a resolution ordering the submission of the proposition for incurring bonded indebtedness for such purpose to the qualified voters of the City at an election;

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the Council, it is advisable to call an election to submit to the electors of the City on the November 5, 2024 ballot the question of whether general obligation bonds of the City (the "Bonds") shall be issued and sold for the purpose of financing the Projects;

WHEREAS, by a vote of not less than two-thirds of the voters of the City voting in favor upon a proposition incurring such indebtedness (or 55% of the voters of the City voting in favor upon a proposition incurring such indebtedness in the event that Proposition 5 is approved by California voters at the November 5, 2024 election), the City is authorized to issue general obligation bonds to finance municipal improvements pursuant to the provisions of Article 1, commencing with section 43600, of Chapter 4 of Division 4 of Title 4 of the California Government Code (the "Bond Law");

WHEREAS, net proceeds from the sale of the Bonds will be used to finance the Projects, and all expenditures will be subject to annual independent audits and oversight;

WHEREAS, no proceeds of the sale of the Bonds shall be expended for salaries, pensions or benefits of City employees; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 10403 *et seq*. of the California Elections Code, it is appropriate for the Council to request the County Board of Supervisors to consolidate the election for the Bonds with any and all other elections to be held in the City on Tuesday, November 5, 2024 and with the statewide election to be held on that same date, and to request the County Elections Department to perform certain election services for the City.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. <u>Call for Election</u>. Pursuant to the Elections Code and the Bond Law, the Council hereby calls an election and submits to the electors of the City the question of whether the Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$50,000,000 shall be issued and sold in one or more series for the purpose of financing the Projects described in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, and paying costs and expenses incident thereto, as set forth more fully in the ballot proposition (the "Measure") approved pursuant to Section 4 hereof. This Resolution constitutes the order of the City to the County to call such election within the boundaries of the City.

Section 2. <u>Date of Election</u>. The date of the election shall be November 5, 2024, and the election shall be held solely within the boundaries of the City.

Section 3. Requests to County. The Council hereby orders that the election called by this Resolution be consolidated with any and all elections also called to be held within the boundaries of the City on November 5, 2024, and hereby requests the Board of Supervisors of Monterey County to

consolidate all such elections with the statewide election to be held on that same date under Elections Code sections 10400 through 10403. Pursuant to Elections Code section 10002, the Council also requests the Board of Supervisors of the County of Monterey to permit the Monterey County Elections Department to provide any and all services necessary for conducting an election, and agrees to pay for said services in full. The Council further authorizes and requests that the County Elections Department provide all such services, including but not limited to providing notice of, conducting, and canvassing the results of the election. The Council acknowledges that the consolidated election will be held and conducted in the manner prescribed in section 10418 of the Elections Code.

Section 4. <u>Ballot Measure and Abbreviated Statement of Measure.</u> The purpose of the election shall be for the voters in the City to vote on the Measure, in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A. The County Elections Department is requested to print the full text of the Measure, which commences with the heading "MEASURE" and includes all of the text thereafter in Exhibit A, in the voter information guide provided to voters for the November 5, 2024 election, with such measure designation as is assigned to the Measure.

The abbreviated form of the Measure to appear on the ballot pursuant to section 13247 of the Elections Code is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

The City Manager of the City or his designee is hereby authorized and directed to make any changes to the text of Exhibits A or B as required to conform to any requirements of the County Elections Department.

Section 5. <u>Voter Approval Requirement</u>. The Measure shall become effective if approved by at least 2/3 of the registered voters voting on the Measure; *provided, however*, that if Proposition 5 is approved by California voters at the November 5, 2024 election, then the Measure shall become effective if approved by at least 55% of the registered voters voting on the Measure.

Section 6. <u>Aggregate Principal Amount of Bonds</u>. The aggregate principal amount of the Bonds shall not exceed 3.5% of the assessed value of all taxable property within the City.

Section 7. <u>Term of Bonds</u>. The Council hereby certifies that the maximum term of each series of the Bonds shall not exceed 40 years and the maximum rate of interest on the Bonds shall not exceed 12% per annum, which interest rate does not exceed the maximum rate permitted by applicable law. The Bonds shall be payable from and secured by *ad valorem* taxes levied and collected in the manner prescribed by the laws of the State of California, all equally and ratably secured, without priority, by the taxing power of the City, if the Measure is approved by the requisite percentage of voters voting thereon as set forth above in Section 5.

Section 8. <u>Transmittal of Resolution</u>. The Council hereby authorizes and directs the Deputy City Clerk to submit a certified copy of this Resolution to the Monterey County Elections Department, as soon as possible and in no event later than eighty-eight days prior to the date set for the election, and to prepare, execute, and transmit to the County all documents necessary to carry out the purposes of this Resolution.

Section 9. <u>Tax Rate Statement</u>. The Tax Rate Statement as signed by the City Manager and attached hereto as Exhibit C is hereby approved, and the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to deliver such Tax Rate Statement to the County Elections Department.

Section 10. <u>Bond Projects List</u>. The Bond Projects List set forth in the Measure lists the specific projects the City proposes to finance with proceeds of the Bonds. Listed repairs, rehabilitation projects and upgrades will be completed as needed. Each project is assumed to include its share of costs of the election and bond issuance, architectural, engineering, and similar planning costs, construction management, and a customary contingency for unforeseen design and construction costs. The final cost of each project will be determined as plans are finalized, construction bids are awarded, and projects are completed. In addition, certain construction funds expected from non-bond sources, including State grant funds for eligible projects, have not yet been secured. Therefore the Council cannot guarantee that the bonds will provide sufficient funds to allow completion of all listed projects.

Section 11. Accountability Requirements. The expenditure of Bond proceeds for the financing of the Projects shall be subject to strict financial accountability requirements, as set forth in the Measure, including but not limited to an annual independent financial audit to ensure that Bond proceeds are expended to finance the Projects as authorized by the voters. The City will have an annual report prepared describing the funds expended and the projects authorized. The Council shall establish and appoint a citizens' oversight committee (the "Oversight Committee"). The Oversight Committee shall annually review the expenditure of the proceeds of the bonds for the prior year and shall report to the Council whether the proceeds of the Bonds were spent in accordance with the purposes set forth in the ballot measure.

Section 12. <u>No Proceeds for Salaries.</u> No Bond proceeds shall be expended for salaries, pensions or benefits of City employees.

Section 13. <u>Ballot Arguments</u>. The City Council authorizes and directs the following Council member(s) [no more than 2]: \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_ to prepare and file a written argument in favor of the Measure and the rebuttal to the argument against the Measure (if any) pursuant to the requirements of the Elections Code and to request that other persons who are not City Council members also sign the argument, up to a maximum of five signers as authorized by Elections Code section 9283. These Council members may, but are not required to, authorize other persons to sign the rebuttal argument, pursuant to the Elections Code.

The deadline for filing all arguments for and against the Measure is as established by the County Elections Department for local jurisdictions and is available from the Department at 1441 Schilling Place, North Building, Salinas, CA 93901, and online at: https://www.countyofmonterey.gov/government/departments-a-h/elections/home, or such other website created by the County. *This website is not incorporated by reference herein*. The location for filing of such arguments is the City Clerk's Office.

Section 14. <u>Impartial Analysis</u>. The City Clerk is instructed to transmit the Measure to the City Attorney along with a request that an impartial analysis be prepared for inclusion in the voter information guide provided to voters for the November 5, 2024, election. Pursuant to Elections Code section 9280, the City Attorney shall prepare an impartial analysis, which shall be filed with the City Clerk no later than the deadline established by the County Elections Department for local jurisdictions. The Council further requests that the County Elections Department print the impartial analysis in the voter information guide in accordance with Elections Code section 9280.

Section 15. <u>General Authorization with Respect to the Bond Election</u>. The members of the Council and the City Manager (each, an "Authorized Representative") and their respective designees are hereby authorized and directed to do any and all things and to execute, deliver, and perform any and all agreements and documents that they deem necessary or advisable in order to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution, including but not limited to such changes to the Exhibits hereto which may be

necessarily or desirable to correct or finalize such Exhibits. All actions heretofore taken by the officers and agents of the City that are in conformity with the purposes and intent of this Resolution are hereby ratified, confirmed, and approved in all respects.

Section 16. <u>Reimbursement</u>. The City declares its official intent to reimburse prior expenditures of the City incurred prior to the issuance and sale of the Bonds in connection with the Projects or portions thereof to be financed by the Bonds. The Council declares the City's intent to reimburse the City with the proceeds of the Bonds for the expenditures with respect to the Projects ("Expenditures") made on and after that date that is no more than 60 days prior to adoption of this Resolution. The City reasonably expects on the date of adoption of this Resolution that it will reimburse the Expenditures with the proceeds of the Bonds.

Section 17. <u>Identification of Projects not an Approval.</u> The identification of the Projects herein and as set forth in Exhibit A and Exhibit B hereto shall not be interpreted as and does not constitute an official approval of any listed project for the California Environmental Quality Act or any other purpose. Furthermore, the listing of facilities in the description of the Project does not imply any particular prioritization among such facilities, which is to be determined by the Council.

Section 18. <u>Effective Date</u>. Pursuant to Government Code section 43608, this Resolution shall take effect upon its adoption by two-thirds (2/3) of all members of the City Council.

The Monterey County Elections Department is requested to print the full text of the Measure exactly as set forth below in the voter information pamphlet to be distributed to voters:

#### **MEASURE**

MEASURE TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS AUTHORIZING THE OF CITY OF MARINA TO ISSUE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS TO FINANCE THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW FIRE AND POLICE STATION AND A COMMUNITY CENTER, INCLUDING COMMUNITY ROOMS

#### **FINDINGS**

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the City Council (the "Council") of the City of Marina (the "City"), it is advisable to improve and enhance essential police and fire services to the community by issuing general obligation bonds that will finance the acquisition, improvement, upgrade and maintenance of fire stations, police stations, facilities and real property, including (i) facilities that support emergency lifesaving medical services and reduce 911 response times, (ii) replacing/repairing outdated stations, and constructing a new community center (collectively, the "Projects");

WHEREAS, the Council intends to issue general obligation bonds to finance the Projects and to fund certain costs in connection with the issuance of such general obligation bonds;

#### **OBJECT AND PURPOSE OF BONDS**

This measure (the "Measure") authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds (the "Bonds"), the object and purpose of which is to finance the Projects and certain costs in connection with the issuance of the Bonds.

The Projects will be completed as needed, and each is assumed to include its share of costs, including planning and construction costs. The final cost of each Project will be determined as real property is purchased, plans are finalized, construction bids are awarded, or projects are completed.

Proceeds of the Bonds may be used to reimburse the City for amounts advanced from the general fund or other funds or accounts to fund Projects when such purchases are made prior to the availability of Bond proceeds.

#### REQUIRED APPROVAL

The Measure shall be deemed approved if approved by at least 2/3 of the registered voters voting on the proposition; *provided*, *however*, that if Proposition 5 is approved by California voters on the same date that voters of the City are voting on the proposed Bond Measure, the Measure shall be deemed to be approved if approved by at least 55% of the registered voters voting on it.

#### **ESTIMATED COST OF PROJECTS**

The estimated cost of the portion of the costs of the Projects to be paid for from the Bonds is \$50,000,000. The estimated cost includes legal and other fees and the cost of printing the Bonds and other costs and expenses incidental to or connected with the authorization, issuance or sale of the Bonds. The cost of the Projects includes planning and construction costs.

#### PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF BONDS

The aggregate principal amount of Bonds to be issued in one or more series is not to exceed \$50,000,000.

#### MAXIMUM INTEREST RATE

The maximum rate of interest to be paid on the Bonds shall not exceed the maximum rate permitted by applicable law.

#### ACCOUNTABILITY REQUIREMENTS

The following accountability measures apply to the issuance of Bonds pursuant to this Measure:

- (a) The specific purpose of the Bonds is to finance the Projects;
- (b) The proceeds from the sale of the Bonds will be used only for the purposes specified in this Measure, and not for any other purpose, including City employee salaries and other operating expenses. The administrative cost of executing the Projects shall not exceed 5 percent of the proceeds from the sale of the Bonds;
- (c) The proceeds of the Bonds will be deposited into an account to be created and held by the City;
- (d) The proceeds from the sale of the Bonds shall only be spent on Projects that serve the jurisdiction of the City;
- (e) The Council certifies that it has evaluated alternative funding sources for the Projects;
- (f) The City Manager of the City shall file an annual report with the Council which report shall contain pertinent information regarding the amount of funds collected and expended, as well as the status of the Projects;
- (g) All expenditures will be subject to oversight by an independent oversight committee, composed of individuals appointed by the Council, to confirm that Bond proceeds are expended only for the purposes described in this Measure. Members of the oversight committee shall receive educational training about bonds and fiscal oversight;
- (h) The City shall conduct an annual, independent financial audit to confirm that Bond expenditures are consistent with the purposes of this Measure, until all of the Bond proceeds have been expended, and such audits shall be posted in a manner that is easily accessible to the public. This annual audit shall be submitted to the California State Auditor for review.
- (i) Any entity owned or controlled by a Council member who voted on whether to place the Measure on the ballot shall be prohibited from bidding on any work funded by the Measure.

#### IDENTIFICATION OF TAX; USE OF REVENUE

The tax imposed by this Measure is an *ad valorem* tax levied upon taxable real property in the City. The tax will be used to pay the principal and interest on the Bonds.

#### **BOND PROJECT LIST**

Bond funds will be used in combination with any other received State matching funds. The City will use bond funds for the following projects:

Construction of a new fire and police station to maintain rapid 9-1-1 emergency response times, disaster and emergency response, and fire and police services.

Construction of a community center to provide safe places for children to play, delivery of city programs and services, and space for public and community meetings.

For any project involving modernization or renovation of a building or the major portion of a building, the City shall be authorized to proceed with new replacement construction if the Council determines that replacement and new construction is economically more practical considering the building's age, condition and other relevant factors.

\* \* \*

The listed projects will be completed as needed. Each project is assumed to include its share of furniture, equipment, architectural, engineering, and similar planning costs, program management, staff training expenses and a customary contingency, and escalation for unforeseen design and construction costs.

The allocation of bond proceeds may be affected by the City's receipt of State matching funds and the final costs of each project. In the absence of State matching funds, which the City will aggressively pursue to reduce the City's share of the costs of the projects, the City may not be able to complete some of the projects listed above. The budget for each project is an estimate and may be affected by factors beyond the City's control. The final cost of each project will be determined as plans are finalized, construction bids are awarded and projects are completed. Based on the final costs of each project, certain of the projects described above may be delayed or may not be completed. Demolition of existing facilities and reconstruction of facilities scheduled for repair and upgrade may occur, if the Council determines that such an approach would be more cost-effective in creating enhanced and operationally efficient campuses. Necessary site preparation/restoration and landscaping, may occur in connection with new construction, renovation or remodeling, including ingress and egress, removing, replacing, or installing irrigation, utility lines, trees and landscaping, redirecting fire access, and acquiring any necessary easements, licenses, or rights of way to the property.

Bond proceeds shall be expended only for the specific purposes identified herein. Proceeds of the bonds may be used to pay or reimburse the City for the cost of City staff when performing work on or necessary and incidental to the bond projects, but not for other administrator salaries.

**MARINA 911 EMERGENCY RESPONSE, SAFETY, ESSENTIAL SERVICES/ FACILITIES MEASURE.** To maintain rapid 911, fire, and emergency response times; ensure Marina's Fire/Police Departments can respond to emergencies, maintain fire/police services, provide local fire/police stations/ community center, shall City of Marina's measure authorizing \$50,000,000 in bonds at legal rates, levying on average \$54.74 per \$100,000 of assessed value, generating approximately \$3,191,000 annually while bonds are outstanding, be adopted, requiring public spending disclosure, all funds spent locally?

#### **EXHIBIT C**

#### TAX RATE STATEMENT

An election will be held in the City of Marina (the "City") on November 5, 2024, to authorize the sale of up to \$50,000,000 in bonds of the City for the specific projects listed in the Bond Project List established by the City, as described in the ballot measure ("Measure"). If the bonds are authorized, the City expects to sell the bonds in one or more series. Principal and interest on the bonds will be payable from the proceeds of tax levies made upon the taxable property in the City. The following information is provided in compliance with sections 9400-9404 of the California Elections Code.

- 1. The best estimate from official sources of the average annual tax rate that would be required to be levied to fund that bond issue over the entire duration of the bond debt service, based on assessed valuations available at the time of filing of this statement or a projection based on experience within the same jurisdiction or other demonstrable factors is 5.474 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation (\$54.74 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation) of all property to be taxed. The best estimate of the final fiscal year in which the tax is anticipated to be collected is 2055-56.
- 2. The best estimate from official sources of the highest tax rate that would be required to be levied to fund that bond issue, and an estimate of the year in which that rate will apply, based on assessed valuations available at the time of filing of this statement or a projection based on experience within the same jurisdiction or other demonstrable factors is 8.394 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation (\$83.94 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation) of all property to be taxed. The best estimate of the year in which the highest tax rate will apply is anticipated to be 2026-27.
- 3. The best estimate from official sources of the total debt service, including the principal and interest, that would be required to be repaid if all the bonds are issued and sold is \$98,912,943.

Voters should note that such estimated tax rates are specific to the repayment of bonds issued under this authorization and are and will be in addition to tax rates levied in connection with other bond authorizations approved or to be approved by local voters for the City or for any other overlapping public agency.

Voters should note that estimated tax rate is based on the ASSESSED VALUE of taxable property on the Monterey County's official tax rolls, not on the property's market value. Property owners should consult their own property tax bills to determine their property's assessed value and any applicable tax exemptions.

Attention of all voters is directed to the fact that the foregoing information is based upon the City's projections and estimates only, which are not binding upon the City. The actual tax rates and the years in which they will apply may vary from those presently estimated, due to variations from these estimates in the timing of bond sales, the amount of bonds sold and market interest rates at the time of each sale, and actual assessed valuations over the term of repayment of the bonds. The dates of sale and the amount of bonds sold at any given time will be determined by the City based on need for construction funds and other factors. The actual interest rates at which the bonds will be sold will depend on the bond market at the time of each sale. Actual future assessed valuation will depend upon the amount and value of taxable property within the City as determined by the Monterey County Assessor in the annual assessment and the equalization process.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 2024-

# AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARINA ORDERING A GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND ELECTION, ESTABLISHING SPECIFICATIONS, REQUESTING CONSOLIDATION WITH OTHER ELECTIONS OCCURRING ON NOVEMBER 5, 2024, AND AUTHORIZING NECESSARY ACTIONS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

RESOLVED, by the City Council (the "Council") of the City Marina (the "City"), within Monterey County, California (the "County"), as follows:

WHEREAS, the City's population has more than doubled since the City was incorporated in 1975, but still relies on the same aging and deteriorating fire stations, police station, and city facilities that were built for a much smaller population;

WHEREAS, more than 80 percent of all 9-1-1 calls to the Marina Fire Department are medical emergencies, such as heart attacks, strokes, and car accidents, and seconds matter in a life-threatening situations, but because aging fire stations are located far from many Marina residents, response times for some areas of the City are close to 10 minutes, much slower than the 5-minute national standard;

WHEREAS, the City's aging fire and police stations (emergency response center) do not meet current earthquake safety standards, and could collapse and prevent first responders from getting to residents in a major earthquake;

WHEREAS, the current fire stations are too small to accommodate the modern technology and life-saving equipment, such as rescue equipment and a ladder truck, to keep the City safe;

WHEREAS, many essential city programs and services are delivered from deteriorating portable buildings that were installed nearly 50 years ago and were intended to be temporary, are not accessible for residents with disabilities, have mold, asbestos, leaky roofs, are not earthquake safe, and do not provide space to support local services;

WHEREAS, the City's deteriorating community center, which includes the community center, city council chambers, community rooms, recreation and City offices is not up to current earthquake, fire safety and ADA standards; yet this space is packed every day by the City's daycare, pre-school, before/ afterschool programs; and other youth, family, and senior programs; and recreation and city employees and the public;

WHEREAS, the cost to upgrade Marina's aging facilities is beyond what the City's current budget can support and the City Council believes that locally controlled funding from a bond measure is needed to construct a new fire station, police station, and community center;

WHEREAS, a bond measure for a fire station, police station, and community center would require strict fiscal accountability protections including public disclosure of all spending, an independent oversight committee, and annual audits;

WHEREAS, all funds from a local bond measure must stay under local control, may only be used for facilities to improve essential services in Marina and cannot be taken away by the State;

WHEREAS, on July 2, 2024, this Council adopted, by a two-thirds vote of all the members of this Council, a Resolution entitled "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARINA, CALIFORNIA, DETERMINING THAT THE PUBLIC INTEREST AND NECESSITY DEMAND THE CONSTRUCTION OF CERTAIN MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENTS AND MAKING FINDINGS RELATING THERETO;"

WHEREAS, in order to provide for the issuance by the City of general obligation bonds to finance the acquisition or improvement of real property to repair or replace the City's aging fire, police station and emergency response center (as further described below and in Exhibit A, the "Projects"), it is necessary for this Council to pass a resolution ordering the submission of the proposition for incurring bonded indebtedness for such purpose to the qualified voters of the City at an election;

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the Council, it is advisable to call an election to submit to the electors of the City on the November 5, 2024 ballot the question of whether general obligation bonds of the City (the "Bonds") shall be issued and sold for the purpose of financing the Projects;

WHEREAS, by a vote of not less than two-thirds of the voters of the City voting in favor upon a proposition incurring such indebtedness (or 55% of the voters of the City voting in favor upon a proposition incurring such indebtedness in the event that Proposition 5 is approved by California voters at the November 5, 2024 election), the City is authorized to issue general obligation bonds to finance municipal improvements pursuant to the provisions of Article 1, commencing with section 43600, of Chapter 4 of Division 4 of Title 4 of the California Government Code (the "Bond Law");

WHEREAS, net proceeds from the sale of the Bonds will be used to finance the Projects, and all expenditures will be subject to annual independent audits and oversight;

WHEREAS, no proceeds of the sale of the Bonds shall be expended for salaries, pensions or benefits of City employees; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 10403 *et seq.* of the California Elections Code, it is appropriate for the Council to request the County Board of Supervisors to consolidate the election for the Bonds with any and all other elections to be held in the City on Tuesday, November 5, 2024 and with the statewide election to be held on that same date, and to request the County Elections Department to perform certain election services for the City.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. <u>Call for Election</u>. Pursuant to the Elections Code and the Bond Law, the Council hereby calls an election and submits to the electors of the City the question of whether the Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$50,000,000 shall be issued and sold in one or more series for the purpose of financing the Projects described in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, and paying costs and expenses incident thereto, as set forth more fully in the ballot proposition (the "Measure") approved pursuant to Section 4 hereof. This Ordinance constitutes the order of the City to the County to call such election within the boundaries of the City.

Section 2. <u>Date of Election.</u> The date of the election shall be November 5, 2024, and the election shall be held solely within the boundaries of the City.

Section 3. Requests to County. The Council hereby orders that the election called by this Ordinance be consolidated with any and all elections also called to be held within the boundaries of the City on November 5, 2024, and hereby requests the Board of Supervisors of Monterey County to consolidate all such elections with the statewide election to be held on that same date under Elections Code sections 10400 through 10403. Pursuant to Elections Code section 10002, the Council also

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requests the Board of Supervisors of the County of Monterey to permit the Monterey County Elections Department to provide any and all services necessary for conducting an election and agrees to pay for said services in full. The Council further authorizes and requests that the County Elections Department provide all such services, including but not limited to providing notice of, conducting, and canvassing the results of the election. The Council acknowledges that the consolidated election will be held and conducted in the manner prescribed in section 10418 of the Elections Code.

Section 4. <u>Ballot Measure and Abbreviated Statement of Measure.</u> The purpose of the election shall be for the voters in the City to vote on the Measure, in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A. The County Elections Department is requested to print the full text of the Measure, which commences with the heading "MEASURE" and includes all of the text thereafter in Exhibit A, in the voter information guide provided to voters for the November 5, 2024 election, with such measure designation as is assigned to the Measure.

The abbreviated form of the Measure to appear on the ballot pursuant to section 13247 of the Elections Code is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

The City Manager of the City or his designee is hereby authorized and directed to make any changes to the text of Exhibits A or B as required to conform to any requirements of the County Elections Department.

Section 5. <u>Voter Approval Requirement</u>. The Measure shall become effective if approved by at least 2/3 of the registered voters voting on the Measure; *provided, however*, that if Proposition 5 is approved by California voters at the November 5, 2024 election, then the Measure shall become effective if approved by at least 55% of the registered voters voting on the Measure.

Section 6. <u>Aggregate Principal Amount of Bonds</u>. The aggregate principal amount of the Bonds shall not exceed 3.5% of the assessed value of all taxable property within the City.

Section 7. <u>Term of Bonds</u>. The Council hereby certifies that the maximum term of each series of the Bonds shall not exceed 40 years and the maximum rate of interest on the Bonds shall not exceed 12% per annum, which interest rate does not exceed the maximum rate permitted by applicable law. The Bonds shall be payable from and secured by *ad valorem* taxes levied and collected in the manner prescribed by the laws of the State of California, all equally and ratably secured, without priority, by the taxing power of the City, if the Measure is approved by the requisite percentage of voters voting thereon as set forth above in Section 5.

Section 8. <u>Transmittal of Ordinance</u>. The Council hereby authorizes and directs the Deputy City Clerk to submit a certified copy of this Ordinance to the Monterey County Elections Department, as soon as possible and in no event later than eighty-eight days prior to the date set for the election, and to prepare, execute, and transmit to the County all documents necessary to carry out the purposes of this Ordinance.

Section 9. <u>Tax Rate Statement</u>. The Tax Rate Statement as signed by the City Manager and attached hereto as Exhibit C is hereby approved, and the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to deliver such Tax Rate Statement to the County Elections Department.

Section 10. <u>Bond Projects List</u>. The Bond Projects List set forth in the Measure lists the specific projects the City proposes to finance with proceeds of the Bonds. Listed repairs, rehabilitation projects and upgrades will be completed as needed. Each project is assumed to include its share of costs of the election and bond issuance, architectural, engineering, and similar planning costs,

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construction management, and a customary contingency for unforeseen design and construction costs. The final cost of each project will be determined as plans are finalized, construction bids are awarded, and projects are completed. In addition, certain construction funds expected from non-bond sources, including State grant funds for eligible projects, have not yet been secured. Therefore, the Council cannot guarantee that the bonds will provide sufficient funds to allow completion of all listed projects.

Section 11. Accountability Requirements. The expenditure of Bond proceeds for the financing of the Projects shall be subject to strict financial accountability requirements, as set forth in the Measure, including but not limited to an annual independent financial audit to ensure that Bond proceeds are expended to finance the Projects as authorized by the voters. The City will have an annual report prepared describing the funds expended and the projects authorized. The Council shall establish and appoint a citizens' oversight committee (the "Oversight Committee"). The Oversight Committee shall annually review the expenditure of the proceeds of the bonds for the prior year and shall report to the Council whether the proceeds of the Bonds were spent in accordance with the purposes set forth in the ballot measure.

Section 12. <u>No Proceeds for Salaries.</u> No Bond proceeds shall be expended for salaries, pensions or benefits of City employees.

Section 13. <u>Ballot Arguments.</u> The City Council authorizes and directs the following Council member(s) [no more than 2]: \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_ to prepare and file a written argument in favor of the Measure and the rebuttal to the argument against the Measure (if any) pursuant to the requirements of the Elections Code and to request that other persons who are not City Council members also sign the argument, up to a maximum of five signers as authorized by Elections Code section 9283. These Council members may, but are not required to, authorize other persons to sign the rebuttal argument, pursuant to the Elections Code.

The deadline for filing all arguments for and against the Measure is as established by the County Elections Department for local jurisdictions and is available from the Department at 1441 Schilling Place, North Building, Salinas, CA 93901, and online at: https://www.countyofmonterey.gov/government/departments-a-h/elections/home, or such other website created by the County. *This website is not incorporated by reference herein.* The location for filing such arguments is the City Clerk's office.

Section 14. <u>Impartial Analysis</u>. The City Clerk is instructed to transmit the Measure to the City Attorney along with a request that an impartial analysis be prepared for inclusion in the voter information guide provided to voters for the November 5, 2024 election. Pursuant to Elections Code section 9280, the City Attorney shall prepare an impartial analysis, which shall be filed with the City Clerk no later than the deadline established by the County Elections Department for local jurisdictions. The Council further requests that the County Elections Department print the impartial analysis in the voter information guide in accordance with Elections Code section 9280.

Section 15. General Authorization with Respect to the Bond Election. The members of the Council and the City Manager (each, an "Authorized Representative") and their respective designees are hereby authorized and directed to do any and all things and to execute, deliver, and perform any and all agreements and documents that they deem necessary or advisable in order to effectuate the purposes of this Ordinance, including but not limited to such changes to the Exhibits hereto which may be necessarily or desirable to correct or finalize such Exhibits. All actions heretofore taken by the officers and agents of the City that are in conformity with the purposes and intent of this Ordinance are hereby ratified, confirmed, and approved in all respects.

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Section 16. Reimbursement. The City declares its official intent to reimburse prior expenditures of the City incurred prior to the issuance and sale of the Bonds in connection with the Projects or portions thereof to be financed by the Bonds. The Council declares the City's intent to reimburse the City with the proceeds of the Bonds for the expenditures with respect to the Projects ("Expenditures") made on and after that date that is no more than 60 days prior to adoption of this Ordinance. The City reasonably expects on the date of adoption of this Ordinance that it will reimburse the Expenditures with the proceeds of the Bonds.

Section 17. <u>Identification of Projects not an Approval.</u> The identification of the Projects herein and as set forth in Exhibit A and Exhibit B hereto shall not be interpreted as and does not constitute an official approval of any listed project for the California Environmental Quality Act or any other purpose. Furthermore, the listing of facilities in the description of the Project does not imply any particular prioritization among such facilities, which is to be determined by the Council.

Section 18. <u>Effective Date</u>. Pursuant to Government Code section 43608, this Ordinance shall take effect upon its adoption by two-thirds (2/3) of all members of the City Council.

Section 19. The City Clerk of the City is hereby directed, upon the passage and adoption of this ordinance, to publish the same once a week for at least two (2) weeks in a newspaper published once a week in the City. No other notice of the election hereby called need be given.

Section 20. This ordinance shall be forthwith entered upon the minutes of the City Council and in the Ordinance Book of the City. This ordinance, being an ordinance calling and ordering an election, shall take effect from and after its final passage and approval.

#### **MEASURE**

MEASURE TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS AUTHORIZING THE OF CITY OF MARINA TO ISSUE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS TO FINANCE THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW FIRE AND POLICE STATION AND A COMMUNITY CENTER, INCLUDING COMMUNITY ROOMS

#### **FINDINGS**

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the City Council (the "Council") of the City of Marina (the "City"), it is advisable to improve and enhance essential police and fire services to the community by issuing general obligation bonds that will finance the acquisition, improvement, upgrade and maintenance of fire stations, police stations, facilities and real property, including (i) facilities that support emergency lifesaving medical services and reduce 911 response times, (ii) replacing/repairing outdated stations, and constructing a new community center (collectively, the "Projects");

WHEREAS, the Council intends to issue general obligation bonds to finance the Projects and to fund certain costs in connection with the issuance of such general obligation bonds;

#### **OBJECT AND PURPOSE OF BONDS**

This measure (the "Measure") authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds (the "Bonds"), the object and purpose of which is to finance the Projects and certain costs in connection with the issuance of the Bonds.

The Projects will be completed as needed, and each is assumed to include its share of costs, including planning and construction costs. The final cost of each Project will be determined as real property is purchased, plans are finalized, construction bids are awarded, or projects are completed.

Proceeds of the Bonds may be used to reimburse the City for amounts advanced from the general fund or other funds or accounts to fund Projects when such purchases are made prior to the availability of Bond proceeds.

#### REQUIRED APPROVAL

The Measure shall be deemed approved if approved by at least 2/3 of the registered voters voting on the proposition; *provided*, *however*, that if Proposition 5 is approved by California voters on the same date that voters of the City are voting on the proposed Bond Measure, the Measure shall be deemed to be approved if approved by at least 55% of the registered voters voting on it.

#### **ESTIMATED COST OF PROJECTS**

The estimated cost of the portion of the costs of the Projects to be paid for from the Bonds is \$50,000,000. The estimated cost includes legal and other fees and the cost of printing the Bonds and other costs and expenses incidental to or connected with the authorization, issuance or sale of the Bonds. The cost of the Projects includes planning and construction costs.

#### PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF BONDS

The aggregate principal amount of Bonds to be issued in one or more series is not to exceed \$50,000,000.

#### MAXIMUM INTEREST RATE

The maximum rate of interest to be paid on the Bonds shall not exceed the maximum rate permitted by applicable law.

#### ACCOUNTABILITY REQUIREMENTS

The following accountability measures apply to the issuance of Bonds pursuant to this Measure:

- (a) The specific purpose of the Bonds is to finance the Projects;
- (b) The proceeds from the sale of the Bonds will be used only for the purposes specified in this Measure, and not for any other purpose, including City employee salaries and other operating expenses. The administrative cost of executing the Projects shall not exceed 5 percent of the proceeds from the sale of the Bonds;
- (c) The proceeds of the Bonds will be deposited into an account to be created and held by the City;
- (d) The proceeds from the sale of the Bonds shall only be spent on Projects that serve the jurisdiction of the City;
- (e) The Council certifies that it has evaluated alternative funding sources for the Projects;
- (f) The City Manager of the City shall file an annual report with the Council which report shall contain pertinent information regarding the amount of funds collected and expended, as well as the status of the Projects;
- (g) All expenditures will be subject to oversight by an independent oversight committee, composed of individuals appointed by the Council, to confirm that Bond proceeds are expended only for the purposes described in this Measure. Members of the oversight committee shall receive educational training about bonds and fiscal oversight;
- (h) The City shall conduct an annual, independent financial audit to confirm that Bond expenditures are consistent with the purposes of this Measure, until all of the Bond proceeds have been expended, and such audits shall be posted in a manner that is easily accessible to the public. This annual audit shall be submitted to the California State Auditor for review.
- (i) Any entity owned or controlled by a Council member who voted on whether to place the Measure on the ballot shall be prohibited from bidding on any work funded by the Measure.

#### IDENTIFICATION OF TAX; USE OF REVENUE

The tax imposed by this Measure is an *ad valorem* tax levied upon taxable real property in the City. The tax will be used to pay the principal and interest on the Bonds.

#### **BOND PROJECT LIST**

Bond funds will be used in combination with any other received State matching funds. The City will use bond funds for the following projects:

Construction of a new fire and police station to maintain rapid 9-1-1 emergency response times, disaster and emergency response, and fire and police services.

Construction of a community center to provide safe places for children to play, delivery of city programs and services, and space for public and community meetings.

For any project involving modernization or renovation of a building or the major portion of a building, the City shall be authorized to proceed with new replacement construction if the Council determines that replacement and new construction is economically more practical considering the building's age, condition and other relevant factors.

\* \* \*

The listed projects will be completed as needed. Each project is assumed to include its share of furniture, equipment, architectural, engineering, and similar planning costs, program management, staff training expenses and a customary contingency, and escalation for unforeseen design and construction costs.

The allocation of bond proceeds may be affected by the City's receipt of State matching funds and the final costs of each project. In the absence of State matching funds, which the City will aggressively pursue to reduce the City's share of the costs of the projects, the City may not be able to complete some of the projects listed above. The budget for each project is an estimate and may be affected by factors beyond the City's control. The final cost of each project will be determined as plans are finalized, construction bids are awarded, and projects are completed. Based on the final costs of each project, certain of the projects described above may be delayed or may not be completed. Demolition of existing facilities and reconstruction of facilities scheduled for repair and upgrade may occur, if the Council determines that such an approach would be more cost-effective in creating enhanced and operationally efficient campuses. Necessary site preparation/restoration and landscaping, may occur in connection with new construction, renovation or remodeling, including ingress and egress, removing, replacing, or installing irrigation, utility lines, trees and landscaping, redirecting fire access, and acquiring any necessary easements, licenses, or rights of way to the property.

Bond proceeds shall be expended only for the specific purposes identified herein. Proceeds of the bonds may be used to pay or reimburse the City for the cost of City staff when performing work on or necessary and incidental to the bond projects, but not for other administrator salaries.

The best estimate from official sources of the highest tax rate that would be required to be levied to fund that bond issue, and an estimate of the year in which that rate will apply, based on assessed valuations available at the time of filing of this statement or a projection based on experience within the same jurisdiction or other demonstrable factors is 8.394 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation (\$83.94 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation) of all property to be taxed. The best estimate of the year in which the highest tax rate will apply is anticipated to be 2026-27.
- 3. The best estimate from official sources of the total debt service, including the principal and interest, that would be required to be repaid if all the bonds are issued and sold is \$98,912,943.

Voters should note that such estimated tax rates are specific to the repayment of bonds issued under this authorization and are and will be in addition to tax rates levied in connection with other bond authorizations approved or to be approved by local voters for the City or for any other overlapping public agency.

Voters should note that estimated tax rate is based on the ASSESSED VALUE of taxable property on the Monterey County's official tax rolls, not on the property's market value. Property owners should consult their own property tax bills to determine their property's assessed value and any applicable tax exemptions.

Attention of all voters is directed to the fact that the foregoing information is based upon the City's projections and estimates only, which are not binding upon the City. The actual tax rates and the years in which they will apply may vary from those presently estimated, due to variations from these estimates in the timing of bond sales, the amount of bonds sold and market interest rates at the time of each sale, and actual assessed valuations over the term of repayment of the bonds. The dates of sale and the amount of bonds sold at any given time will be determined by the City based on the need for construction funds and other factors. The actual interest rates at which the bonds will be sold will depend on the bond market at the time of each sale. Actual future assessed valuation will depend upon the amount and value of taxable property within the City as determined by the Monterey County Assessor in the annual assessment and the equalization process.
