Argument In Favor of Measure U

Vote Yes on Measure U to keep Marina safe.

Marina has grown since becoming a city five decades ago. Aging city facilities now threaten public safety.

Marina's aging fire station and police station don't meet earthquake standards and need to be more than double the size to meet public safety operational and critical essential services functions.

Over 80% of 911 calls to Marina Fire Department are medical emergencies, like heart attacks, strokes, and accidents. Response times in some areas are 10 minutes, much slower than the 5-minute standard. Minutes mean the difference between life and death. A new fire station must be built at a location that improves response times for all residents.

Many city services are delivered from temporary portable buildings installed in 1975. Fifty years later those portables are still in use, increasingly deteriorated, have leaky roofs, are not ADA accessible and are too small to meet current workforce needs, much less future needs.

Marina's one inadequate and deteriorating community space is used daily by both children in afterschool programs and seniors.

Voting Yes on Measure U will provide a safe and up-to-date fire station, police station, and community facilities to:

- Provide rapid 911 response to fires, medical emergencies, and disasters
- Provide facilities to meet operational and community needs
- Provide safe places for children and seniors
- Ensure emergency services remain operational in an earthquake

If not now, when will we build them? Do we pass the problem on to the next generation?

Measure U requires strict fiscal accountability and local control:

- Every penny must be used locally
- Public spending disclosure, audits, and an oversight committee ensure funds are spent properly
- No funds can be used for salaries
