## SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCES CALL LEADS TO THE ARREST OF FIVE SUBJECTS IN MARINA.

On June 18, 2011 at 0605 hours, a Marina citizen reported that two persons were seen removing items from a vehicle and placing the items into another vehicle on the 500-block of Wilson Court. One of the involved vehicles was being driven by a female, as a male tampered with other vehicles in the area. The involved subjects were last seen entering a vacant residence.

After receiving this information Marina Officers responded along with California State of Monterey Bay Officers (CSUMB) that were requested for assistance. On arrival, the vacant residence was surrounded and initially the occupants refused to exit. After repeated orders to exit, two subjects voluntarily surrendered, and three additional subjects were found hiding inside. All Five were arrested.

The vehicle that was scene driving around the area was determined to be stolen from the City of Salinas.

Further investigation led officers to believe that a sexual assault may have been committed inside of the residence. One of the arrestees, a female juvenile, was transported to a local hospital for medical treatment. She was later identified as a victim in this investigation.

A male juvenile and a female juvenile were arrested for several violations, including trespassing, probation violations, and possession of a stolen vehicle. They were both booked into the Monterey County Jail.

Shane Mathew Jones (18 years old) was arrested for trespassing.

Dylan James Erickson (19 years old) was arrested for trespassing, violation of probation, and numerous sexual assault violations, including Rape and having unlawful sex with a minor. Erickson was booked into the Monterey County Jail.

If this incident was not promptly reported to the Marina Police Department, it is highly likely that this incident including the sexual assault would not have been solved. The Marina Police Department would like to thank the Marina Citizen that reported this incident and the CSUMB Police Officers that responded to assist.
